

Absorbing Screen Drama Commences Friday At Ohio

All the craftsmanlike elements, which, fused together, produce a superior and absorbing screen drama, are present in "Danger Signal," the film which will open at the Ohio theatre Friday.

Co-starring Fay Emerson and Zachary Scott, important new stars, the picture recounts, with power and sympathy, the adventures of Hilda Fenchurch, a capable, intelligent young stenographer, whose white-collar routine was shattered one day when Ronnie Marsh intruded upon her career, twisting and shattering not only her own life but casting also an indelible stamp upon her family, her friends and everything she held dear.

Ronnie Marsh is no ordinary villain. Suave, self-assured, outwardly gracious and even gentle, it is his great fortune to find refuge with the Fenchurch family. Coming to the Ohio theatre Friday, will be "I Love a Band Leader" with Phil Harris and Leslie Brooks. Paced by nine lively songs and hilarious situations, the picture turns out to be a terrific sensation. It's a joyous live jam-boree that swings merrily into your hearts.
