

# Phil Harris And Rochester Star In Quilna's Hit Picture

Those rollicking comics from the Jack Benny air show, Phil Harris and Rochester are going to town as the stars of the new musical jamboree of song and laughter, "I Love a Band Leader," opening Friday at the Quilna theatre.

The screen play is filled with comicalities for the expert exploitation of boy Phil and Rochester. Opening with the two as scene painters in a night club, the fun starts immediately on its rollicking way. When Phil quits work, as a gag, he ties on the dress suit of one of the performers, and after duly impressing Leslie Brooks, a singer trying to get a job in the night club, trips, falls, hits his head and loses his memory.

The bitter consequence of the tragic triangle which involves two sisters in competition for the same man are comprehensively demonstrated in "Danger Signal," the film which has Faye Emerson and Zachary Scott team in a fast-paced tale of love and double-dealing.

The smalltown scene is accurately flavorfully conveyed as the life of Hilda Fenchurch, played by Faye Emerson, is charted and her devotion to her white-collar job and her family traced. Kind and affectionate Hilda is unprepared for the suave and convincing enticement of Ronnie Marsh, played by Zachary Scott, who loves her and leaves her for her sister.

Teh determined and relentless execution of Hilda's plans for exacting revenge and rescuing her passion-blinded sister from the arms of the soundrely Ronnie, makes for a constantly absorbing film, now showing at the Ohio theatre.

Great news just has arrived. It is that of the plans of the Sigma theatre to hold over "Daltons Ride Again" with Kent Taylor, Alan Curtis, Lon Chaney and Noah Beery, Jr. Also "Follow That Woman" with William Gargan and Nancy Kelly. Gloria Jean plays the title role in the film. Sharing the billing is "Oklahoma Raiders"—another, entertainment-providing picture packed with plenty of action.
