Vets Quarantined By Smallpox Victim

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 22—(INS)—Two thousand homesick Pacific veterans today idly watched a boat take ashore the smallpox victim who caused their Christmas quarantine aboard the Navy transport U. S. M. Grundy. The smallpox victim was T-5 Francis R. Price, Wheeling, W. Va.

A chickenpox sufferer, Pfc. John B. Lezotte of Detroit, Mich., was removed at the same time to Barnes General hospital. The rest of the men were being processed for discharge aboard ship and all were expected to be homeward bound within three days after the lifting of the quarantine Christmas morning.

Boatloads of mail, newspapers and gifts of milk, fruit and vegetables poured aboard the quarantined vessel, anchored in the middle of the Willamette river at Portland.

Brown Was Not Funny To Japs

COLUMBUS, Dec. 22—(INS)—Funnyman Joe F. Brown wasn't so funny to the Japs, it was revealed in Columbus today by Maj. Gen. Robert S. Beighler, commanding general of Ohio's 37th Division.

The actor was credited with killing two Japs while on an entertainment tour on the jungle fighting fronts, the general said.

The comedian and the general met on the stage of a packed house where Brown had just completed a show. Brown called Beighler to the stage and the disclosure of the Japs killed came out during the pair's reminiscence.

Beighler recalled that Brown was with his division when it stormed into Cagayan valley in Northern Luzon last June. He said that Brown got the Japs as he leaped from the lead tank of the spearhead that took Bambang, Yamashita's headquarters.

"Without rest, always happy and making the boys happy too," Beighler said, "he was always at the front between shows."
