

"Sunbonnet Sue" Is Coming To Quilna New Year's Eve

The Quilna theatre will begin the New Year at midnight Monday with "Sunbonnet Sue," starring Gale Storm and Phil Reagan. The delightful film has all the ingredients that go to make a movie good—suspense, humor, and romance.

Currently playing at the theatre is "Fallen Angel" with Alice Faye, Dana Andrews and Linda Darnell. It reveals the shocking tale of a girl whose love for a man is haunted by the irrefragable hold the terrible fascination of another woman has on him; of a man who only can be freed from the overpowering obsession of lascivious lips and a taunting smile—by murder; and of another girl whose sultry beauty and inviting embrace holds the promise of tragedy.

To greet those night owls who enjoy midnight shows is the news that the Ohio theatre will have a midnight showing of "San Antonio" with Errol Flynn and Alexis Smith New Year's Eve. The roaring west, in the days of Wild Bill Hickok, the Dalton Boys and Peter Alice, with its colorful women, its turbulent cattle towns and its legendary history lives again.

Briefly, the story is concerned with an era in Texas history when her great nomadic cattle herds were being preyed upon by highly organized bands of night raiders, and in an effort to decimate the herds and ruin the men who owned them, barbed wire fences had not made their appearance on the free range of Texas and it was left to the ranchers themselves to defend both their lives and their lands from the predatory outlaws.

Also advanced a notch in rank, Hargrove, once again played by Walker, has not lost any of the impetuousness, humor and charm which made him America's most highly applauded basic trainee, and his adventures with his racketeering buddy, Pvt. Mulvehill, played by Wynn and their tough overlord, Sgt. Cramp, played by Chill Wills, again involve him in a series of preposterous situations which eventually land him in the guard house.

The State theatre currently is featuring "Pinochio," the masterpiece of work created by Walt Disney and his staff. "Pinochio" was written during the latter part of the last century by Carlo Lorenzini under the pen name of C. Collodi. The story first appeared in installments in a popular Italian magazine under the title of "Le Avventure di Pinochio." In the early 1900's the story was first published in the U. S., in book form, and immediately became a success. Today it is considered a childhood classic, with a host of admirers.

Then the Lyric has "Boot Hill Bandits" and "Top Sergeant Mulligan," which will play thru until Saturday midnight when two pictures, equal owners of suspenseful plots, open. The films will be "Whispering Smith" and "Mummy's Curse."

On tap at the Allen theatre will be "Tall In The Saddle" beginning Sunday. The film stars John Wayne and furnishes plenty of action and entertainment for all. Sharing the bill will be "Sheriff of Las Vegas." Now showing at
