

Theatres Preparing Films For New Year's Celebration

Just as the theatres prepared for the Christmas holiday, so they are doing for the New Year. Several theatres have scheduled new pictures to open New Year's eve for a midnight showing.

The Sigma theatre, however, will open the day before New Year's eve with "What Next Cpl. Hargrove," starring Robert Walker and Keenan Wynn in the roles they made so popular with the first picture, "See Here, Pvt. Hargrove."

Even tho he has a new rank, Marion Hargrove still manages to get into some of the craziest situations, but regardless of how difficult the position, he is able to wrangle out of it some way.

Opening at 5 p. m. Monday at the Ohio theatre and running thru a midnight performance and thru the rest of the week will be "San Antonio" with Errol Flynn and Alexis Smith.
