

# Bob Walker And Keenan Wynn Teamed In "Hargrove" Film

Robert Walker revives the infectious warmth and humor of his celebrated Pvt. Hargrove characterization in the sequel to the popular GI adventures "What Next Cpl. Hargrove?" the film which opened Sunday at the Sigma theatre.

Reunited with his buddy of the earlier film, the racketeering Pvt. Mulvehill, the two pals again bring on the wrath of their top sergeant as they go on a rampage of riotous adventures and blunders in France.

Hargrove's advancement in rank has not lessened his agility and talent for getting into trouble. His proclivity for taking short cuts inevitably brings him to the wrong place at the wrong time. He becomes a hero to a liberated French village to the embarrassment of the Allied occupation authorities.

Lush with terse melodrama, boisterous action and breath-taking scenery, the latest outdoor drama in glorious technicolor, "San Antonio" continues into the New Year at the Ohio theatre. The picture traces the stirring adventures of embittered cowmen who undertake a range war to save cattle herds from the ravages of organized gun-hands and rustlers.

As Clay Hardin, Erol Flynn has the title role with Alexis Smith coming in for honors in the feminine role.

At the Quilna theatre is a film steeped in the Gay Nineties era which has thrilled audiences since its opening. The film is "Sunbonnet Sue" with Gale Storm and Phil Regan.

Scenes of old-time New York form an unusually interesting background for the film with tunes from Regan and Miss Storm. Shaping the bill is "Gul of the Lumberlost."

Currently showing at the State theatre is "Love Letters" with Joseph Cotten and Jennifer Jones. Both actor and actress present a magnificent performance in the film which tells of a girl who cannot remember how she supposedly had killed her husband.

A riotous piece of celluloid was shown to Lyric audiences New Year's Eve. It was "Earl Carter's Vanities" with Constance Moore and Dennis O'Keefe. In a regular sort of way, things begin to happen and turn the picture into a laugh riot.

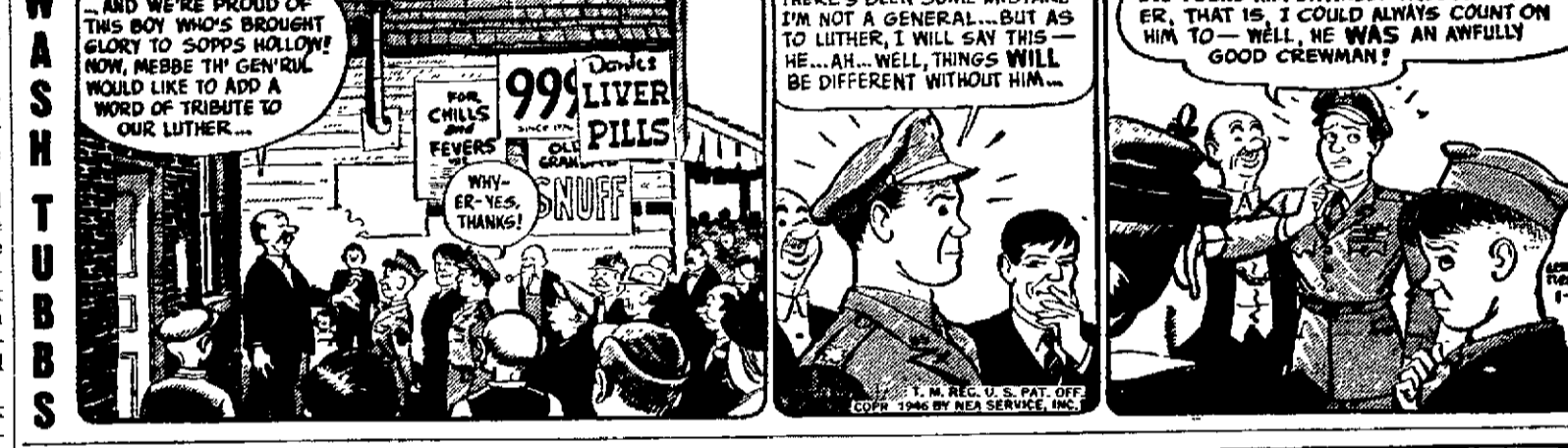
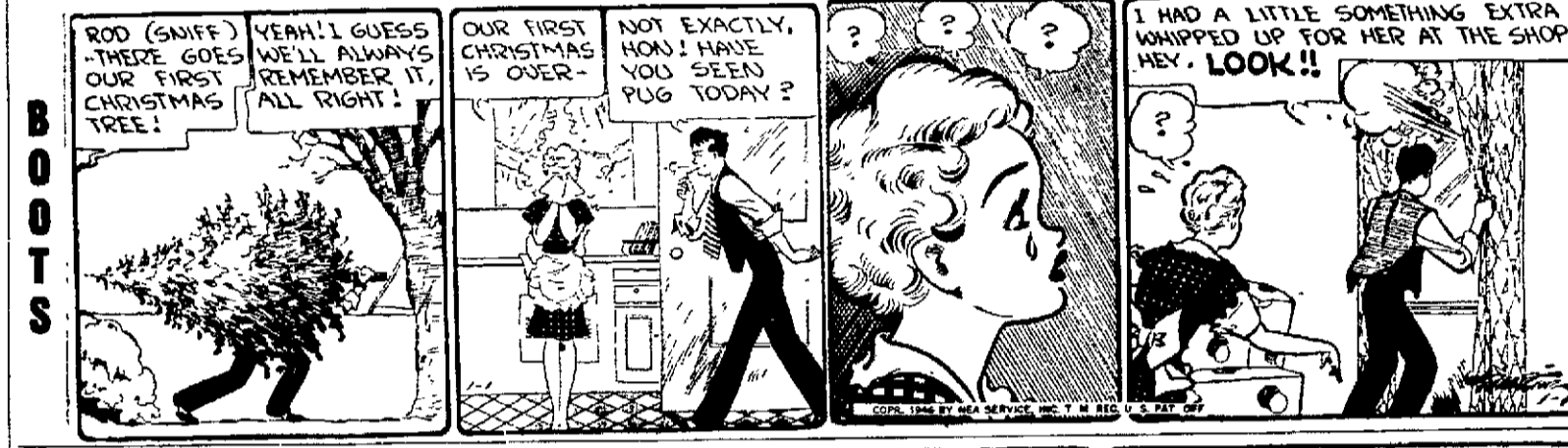
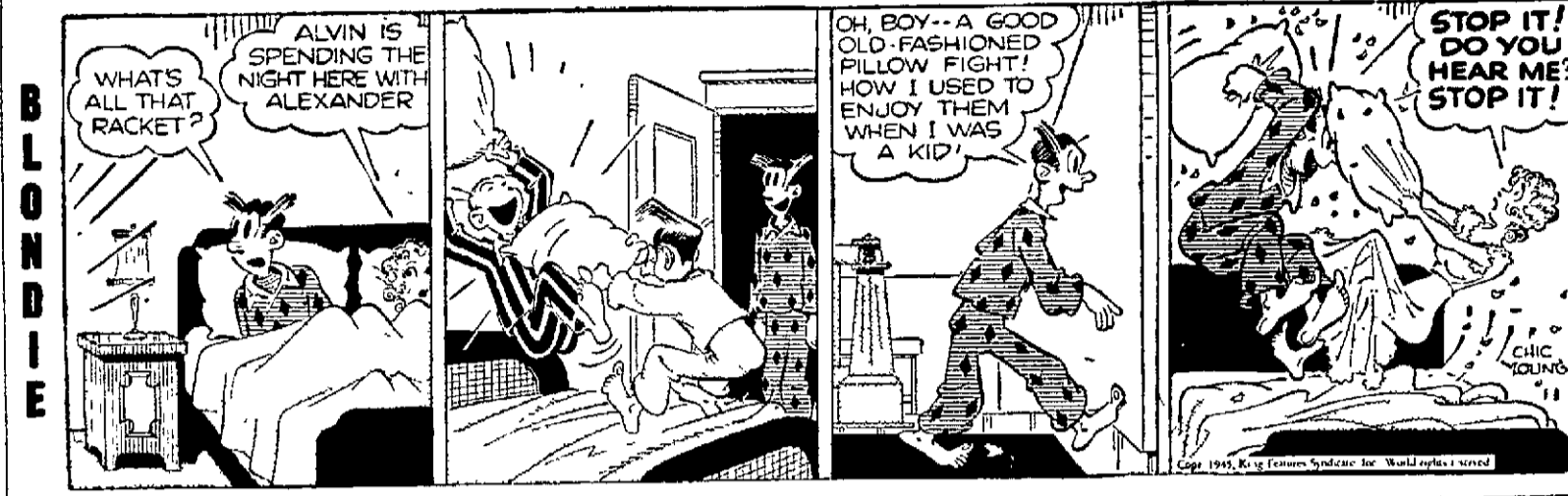
