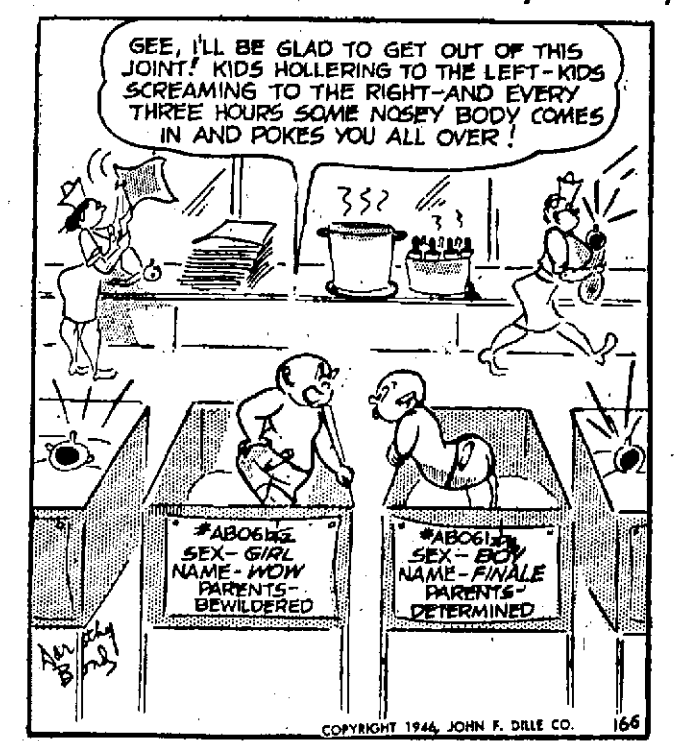

CLIMBING PERCH MAKES OVERLAND TRIPS

When we think of a fish, we are almost sure to think of water. We know that when ordinary fish are taken out of water, they will die before long, sometimes in a few minutes. They die for the reason that the air fails to give them the oxygen they need.

People and furry animals have lungs, and with their lungs they take oxygen from the air, but fish have gills. The gills take oxygen from water, not from the air. A fish will tend to "drown" in the air, just as a human being will drown if he is under water too long.

Yet Asia and Africa have climbing perch which are able to get out of the water, climb the banks and "walk"! This has been observed hundreds of times, and there simply is no question about it.

There is, however, a question as to whether these fish can climb trees. Reports have come from India that climbing perch have been seen on the trunks of trees at heights of from five to seven feet above the ground. On the other hand, scientists have put climbing perch at the base of

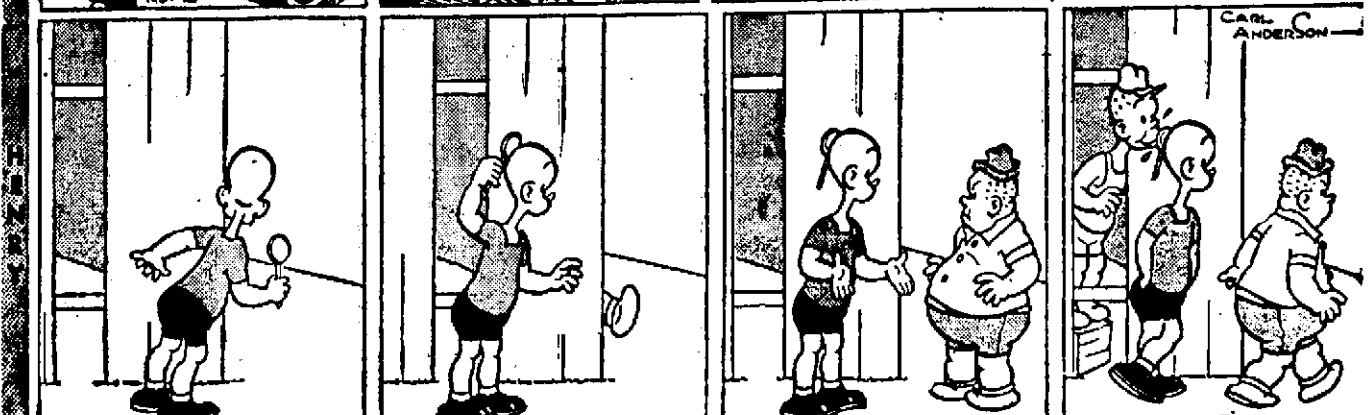
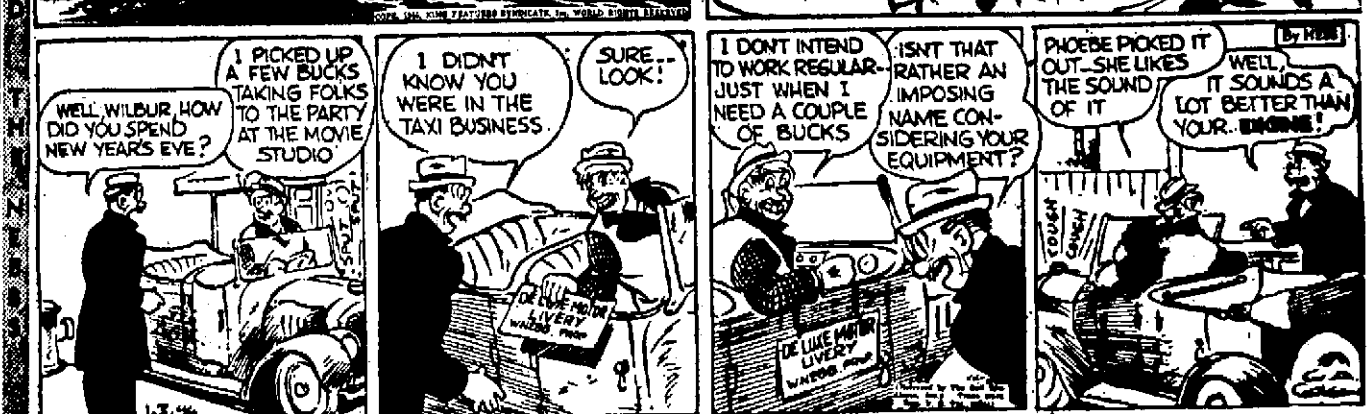
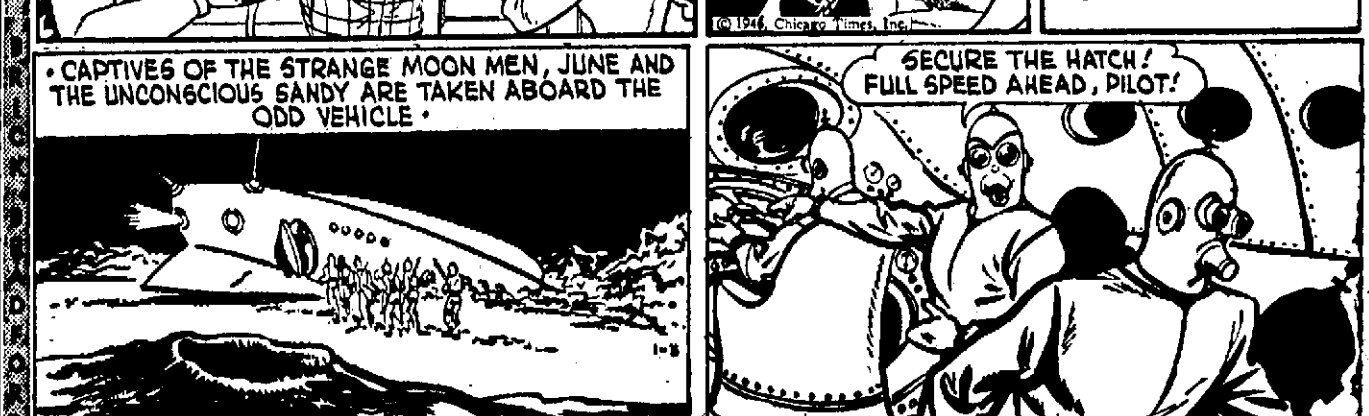
