WHEELING, W. Va., Jan. 5.—(UP)—A preliminary hearing was being arranged today for Jack Heaney, 43, Youngstown, O., who after several hours of intense questioning yesterday admitted that he was the third man sought in connection with the September hijacking of a \$5,000 shipment of liquor.

Chief of Police Alonzo Hixenbaugh said the Ohioan also signed a confession that he cracked and looted the Shafer Distributing Co. safe here last month of approximately \$700.
