### Army Recruiting Support Urged

COLUMBUS, Jan. 6—(UP)—Proclamations were issued today by Gov. Frank J. Lausche of Ohio, Gov. Clarence W. Meadows of West Virginia, Gov. Simeon S. Willis of Kentucky, and Gov. Ralph F. Gates of Indiana, calling on the people of those states to support Fifth Service Command Army recruiting week, Jan. 29-25.

The proclamations call attention to the advantages offered young men from 17 to 24 by the armed forces voluntary recruiting act.

The Fifth Service Command now stands seventh among the 24 overseas theatres and service commands in the U. S. in the number of voluntary enlistments obtained.

The War department has set a goal of 1,600,000 voluntary enlistments by July 1, of which 334,423 already have been obtained. Of this total, \$14 per cent have enlisted in the Fifth Service Command.
