

'They Were Expendable' Due At Ohio Theatre Thursday

Hailed to the public as one of the top pictures of the year, the film "They Were Expendable" makes its debut a day earlier than scheduled at the Ohio theatre.

Coming to the theatre Thursday rather than Friday, the film which has Robert Montgomery and John Wayne in the title roles, tells the heroic story of the men who risked dangers beyond imagination to transport Gen. MacArthur and his family to a submarine which in turn took them to Australia.

When the story first appeared in book form, it was appraised by critics the country over. Now, in film form, it's even more exciting and brings home its title, "They Were Expendable," with twice as much force and meaning.

Cary Grant plays the role of a newspaperman whose many adventures wind their way into the film "Penny Serenade," now showing at the Quilna theatre. With Irene Dunne in the feminine role as his wife, Grant proceeds on his merry way in the newspaper business, but many obstacles, unforeseen of course, loom their ugly heads, halting his progress in some cases.

Spread out over a period of 10 weeks, the picture proves to have both suspense and romance.
