

# Limaites Get Host Of Films To Choose From On Saturday

Embracing a multitude of subjects, the pictures on tap for Saturday theatregoers will be met with welcoming beyond fondest expectations. **Power Company Merger Sought**  
PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 12 (AP)—Application for approval of a proposed merger of the Marion-Reserve Power Co., Marion, Ohio River Power, Inc., Cleveland, into the Ohio Public Service Co., Cleveland, was filed yesterday with the Securities and Exchange Commission by the three companies and their parents, Cities Service Power & Light Co.

Under the proposed plan, all outstanding preferred stock of Public Service and Marion-Reserve held by others than Cities Service will be converted into shares of four per cent cumulative preferred of the surviving company, on the basis of one share of new preferred, plus a cash adjustment, for each share of preferred of Public Service and Marion-Reserve.

In order that not more than 156,332 shares of new preferred would be outstanding after the merger, preferred stockholders would be given time to sell to the surviving company the new preferred issued to them at \$105 a share plus dividends.

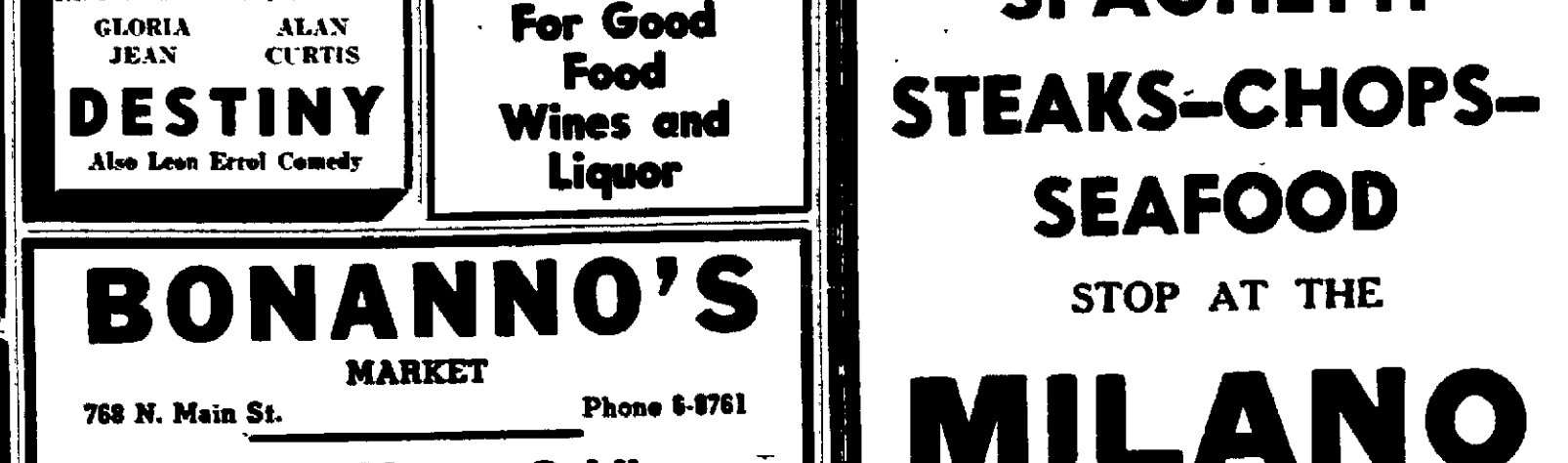
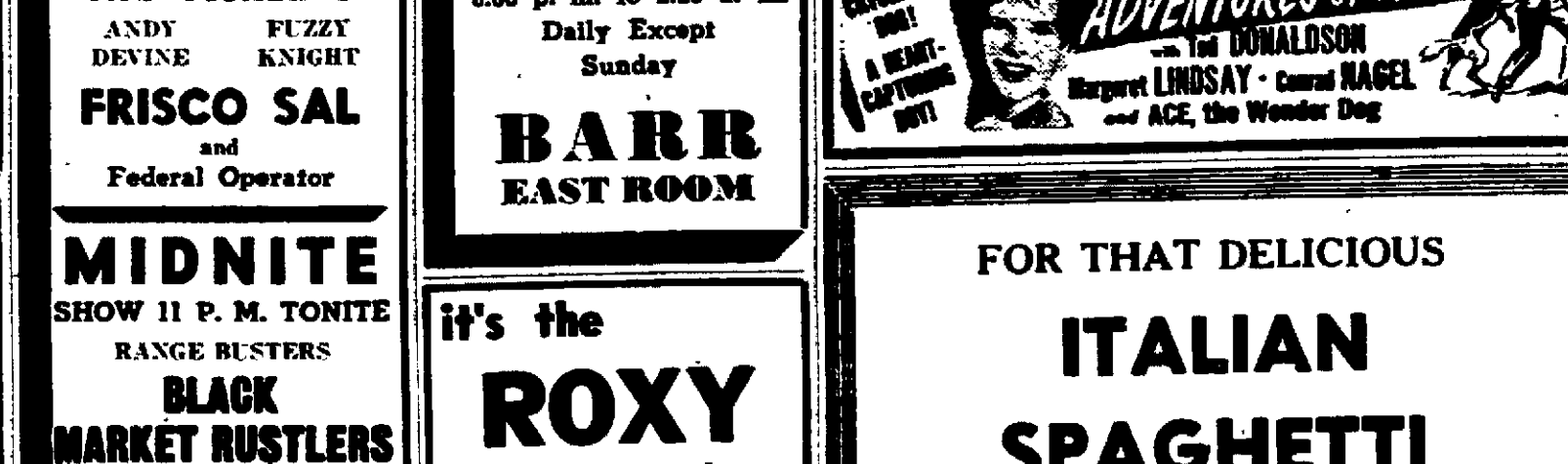
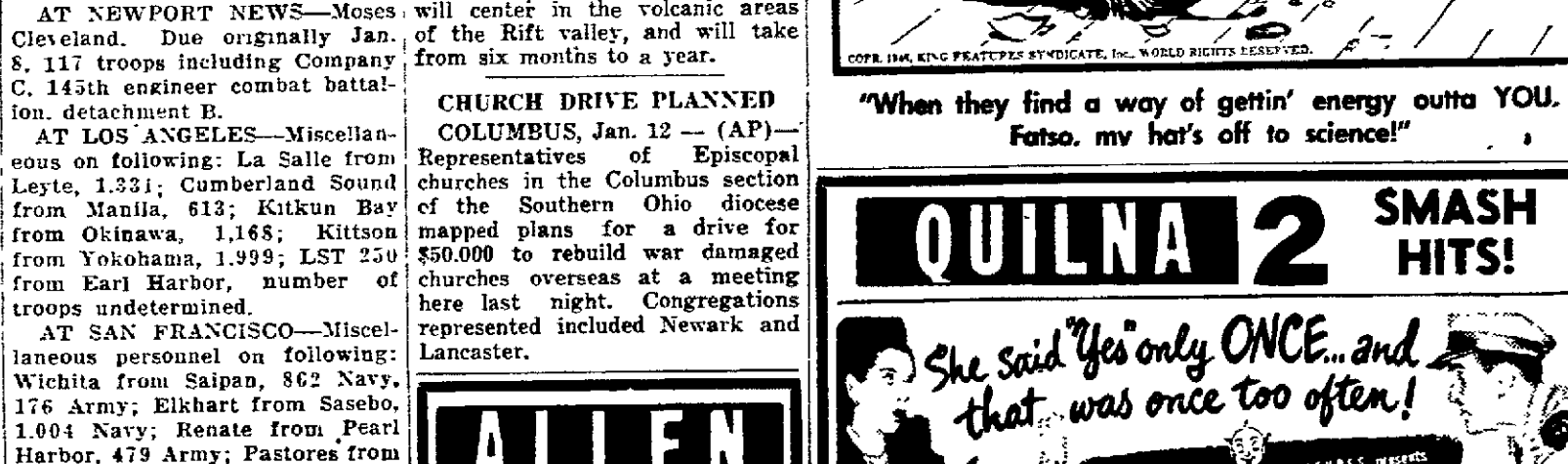
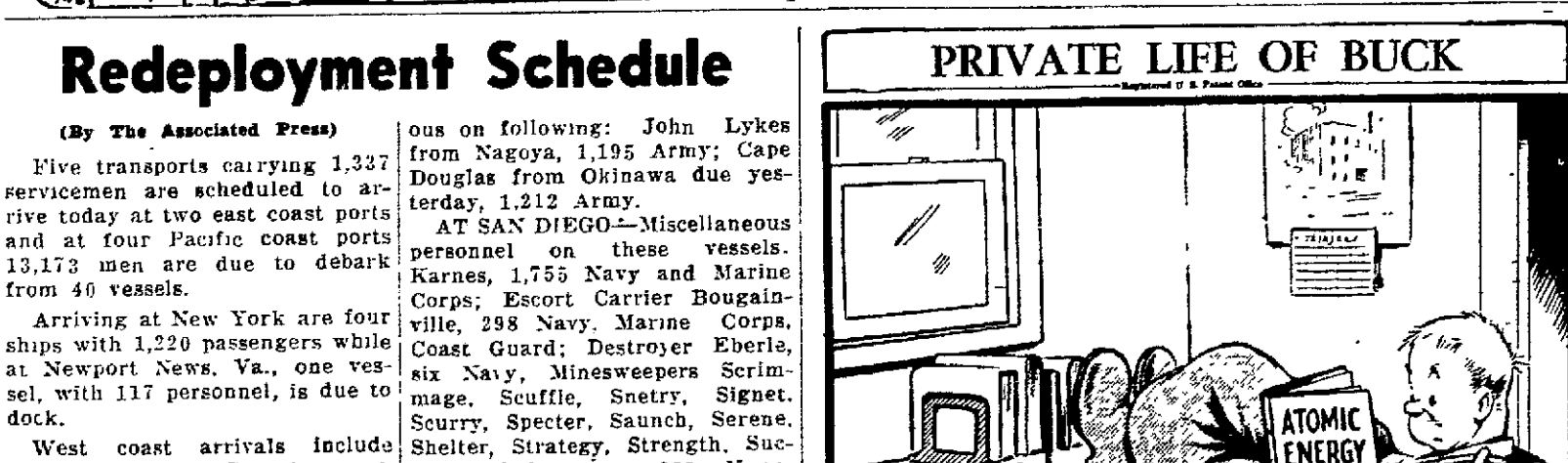
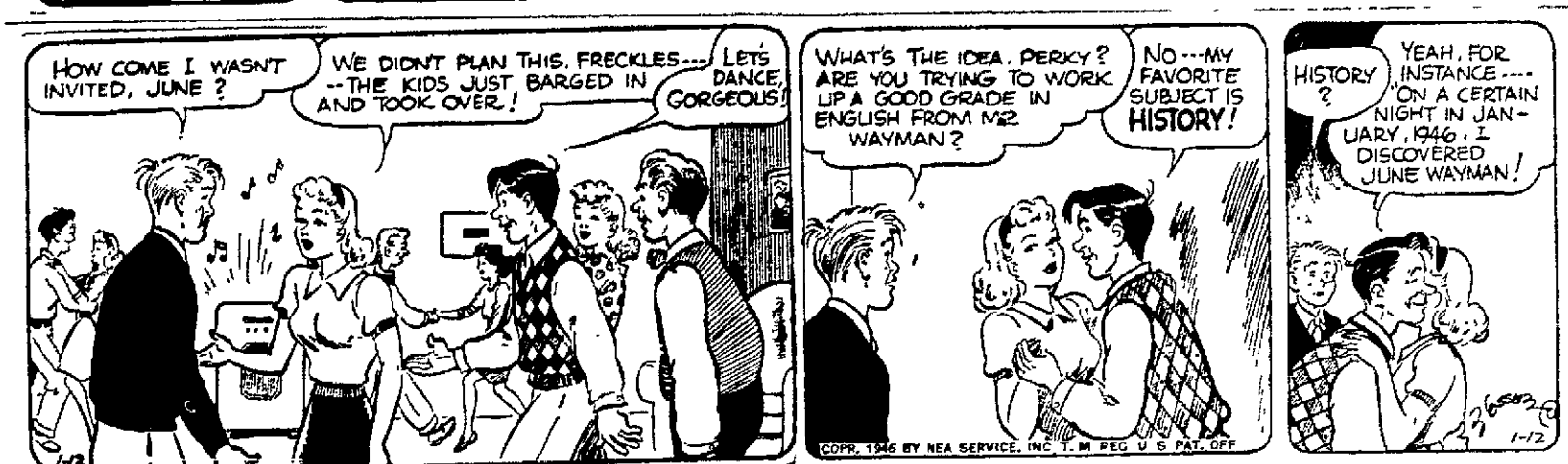
DETROIT, Jan. 12 (AP)—A Federal Communications Commission hearing to determine the "policy on freedom of speech" of WKRC, Cincinnati radio station, is sought by the CIO-United Automobile Workers, union headquarters here announced.

The union said that its petition to FCC stated that WKRC agreed to broadcast a "series of programs presented by the Catholic church on many questions engaging public attention, x x x."

"Three broadcasts on the program were carried, but the station said it could not be the vehicle for the expression of the views of the Catholic clergy on the rights of labor."

There was no immediate comment from WKRC officials.

## Redeployment Schedule

Five transports carrying 1,327 servicemen are scheduled to arrive today at two east coast ports and at four Pacific coast ports. 13,173 men are due to embark from 40 vessels.

Arriving at New York are four ships with 1,220 passengers while at Newport News, Va., one vessel, with 117 personnel, is due to dock.

West coast arrivals include eight ships at San Francisco with 2,352; five at Los Angeles with 5,316; two at Portland, Ore., with 2,407, and 25 at San Diego, Calif., with 2,451. No troops are expected at Seattle and Tacoma, Wash.

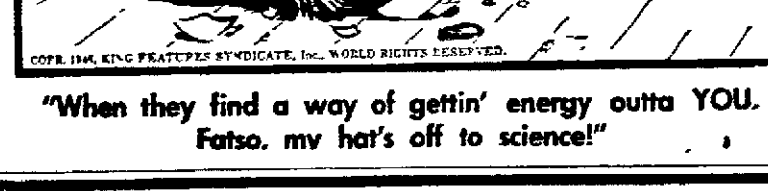
