Federal Aid for Education Boomed

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15—(AP)—Federal aid for education is being boomed again in congress, and this time its backers say they are sure the boom won't bust. Leading the new effort to get government money for public schools is a senate team that pulls together on few other matters. It is composed of Robert A. Taft, rock-ribbed Republican from well-wheeled Ohio, and Lister Hill, New Dealer from deep South Alabama. "We are trying to work out a plan," Hill said today. "It would be predicated on the proposition that certain states are just financially unable to provide an adequate educational opportunity for their children."

FLEMINGTON, N. J., Jan. 15—(UP)—State police said today that Steward Housel, 48, High Bridge, N. J., had confessed the hammer slaying of Mrs. Lillian Hinkle, 17, and Tom Davis, 55, whose bodies were found on the Hinkle farm Sunday. "I don't know why I did it. I just killed them," police quoted Housel as saying. Housel's wife, Lizzie, is a foster daughter of Mrs. Hinkle and police said she was named beneficiary in an insurance policy held by 600,000 worth of petroleum products the slain woman. They established that as a possible motive for the slaying.
