

Wide Variety of Shows Due For Saturday Movie - Goers

Gracing the theatre marquees this Saturday is an assorted group of pictures which are almost certain to meet with the approval of everyone. The variety is large with comedy topping the list.

At the Ohio theatre is the last word in motion picture entertainment, the deluxe comedy-with-music, "Stork Club" which arrived Friday and settled down to what will undoubtedly prove to be one of the funniest to hit Lima in a long time.

It is seldom that a film combines as many desirable elements so successfully as does this film. Everything about it is top-cast, story, music, background, all of it adding up to fun on a grand scale. Starring Betty Hutton in a role perfectly suited to her acting and singing talents, the picture features in her support, Barry Fitzgerald, Don DeFore, Robert Benchley, Bill Goodwin, Iris Adrian, Mikhail Rasumny, Mary Young and introduced, Andy Russell, radio's newest singing find.

"Love, Honor and Goodbye," currently showing at the Quilna theatre is a farce comedy-romance of rollicking humor with an ultra-modern setting in post-war New York.

Virginia Bruce co-stars with Edward Ashley, the impressive young Air Transport Command sergeant who just returned to Hollywood after three years in the service, and the story tells of a lovely young matron with stage ambitions and a doting husband, Edward Ashley. He backs her play hoping it is a flop—and it is.

"This Love of Ours" currently playing at the Sigma theatre and starring Merle Oberon, Claude Rains, and a new star, Charles Korvin, is what might turn out to be the romantic story of the day. It tells of a 12-year-old girl torn between love for her father and hatred for his new wife, which, it turns out, is really her own mother.

Her father, 12 years previous, had left her mother, played by Miss Oberon, because he believed her unfaithful. Meeting her 12 years later, they are reconciled and everything moves along smoothly until the child thinks that the woman is imposing.

Opening Sunday at the State theatre will be the film "Too Young to Know" with Joan Leslie and Robert Hutton. Telling of a couple who married but found later, to their own dismay, that life wasn't just a bowl of cherries, the film is packed with emotion. Shaping the billing is "Follow That Woman" with Nancy Kelly and William Gargan.

In again and out again, the film "Babes on Swing Street" will open Saturday night at the Lyric theatre. Currently there for one day stand is "Frisco Sal" with Turban Boy, a fast moving picture with gun battles and plenty of action. Charing the bill is "Arizona Round-Up."

Thrilling young and old alike, the picture "Riders of the Deadline" with William Boyd as Hopalong Cassidy, will move on Saturday to make way for the two films, "Wanted by the Police" with Frankie Darre, and its co-feature, "Song of the Range" with Jimmy Wakeley at the Allen theatre.

COMPROMISE BILL ON POLLUTION SET

House Group To Get Measure In Near Future

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19—(AP)—A compromise bill on stream pollution will be presented shortly to the house rivers and harbors committee.

Hoping to climax years-long debate over methods of purifying the country's streams, Chairman Mansfield (D-Tex) is drafting the bill on the basis of last year's hearings on two conflicting measures.

These measures have been pending in congress for a long time. One by Rep. Mundt (R-SD) would give the federal government broad powers of enforcement. The other by Rep. Spence (D-Ky) would set up a voluntary plan of cooperation between local and federal authorities.

One congressional faction opposes compulsion as dangerous to state's rights, the other insisting that new enforcement is needed.
