

Top Films Showing in Lima Theatres This Week

Technicolor Production Due Tuesday

With nearly the whole nation's approval stamped on them, the films at Lima theatres this Sunday are awaiting the O. K. from this corner of the continent.

With only two more days to run at the Quilna theatre, one of the contestants for the Academy Award, "Leave Her to Heaven" comes Tuesday.

Given the benefit of a stunning technicolor production and an exceptional cast headed by Gene Tierney, Cornel Wilde and Jeanne Craine, the film takes its place among the outstanding motion pictures of the year.

As the millions who have read the book will testify, the unusual story of the girl who was guilty of the deadliest of the seven deadly sins, and who would stop at nothing, even murder, to be loved as completely as she herself loved, holds in it every element of a great picture. When the "saved" eccentric millionaire rewards Betty for her work by giving her charge accounts in all the best known shops in New York plus a luxurious apartment in one of the finest hotels and a chauffeur and limousine, everything is fine with Betty, but when her boy friend, Marine Don DeFore, returns home, she gets the raised eyebrow for he can't understand how a hat-check girl can have all this.

A new star was introduced to the public Saturday at the Sigma theatre in the person of Charles Korvin. Tall, handsome with dark curly hair, this newcomer definitely made an impression on the female population of the city of Lima.
