

Drama Holds Sway Saturday In Local Theatre Billings

GI Brides Ready To Leave for U. S.

TIDWORTH Eng, Jan 26 — (INS)—More than 450 brides of U. S. servicemen prepared today to leave the Hampton Downs camp for the United States aboard two special trains for Southampton. They will sail for the U. S. aboard the liner Argentina tonight.

Originally 464 brides and their babies were scheduled to sail on the Argentina. Eleven brides were held back for various reasons, and 453 will make the trip accompanied by 173 children.

One bride, Mrs. Esme Thoma, 18, who hoped to rejoin her husband at Weston, Ohio, was refused permission to sail because she is an expectant mother.

Army rules prohibit the sailing of any brides three months before and three months after bearing a child.

Redeployment Schedule

Nearly 16,000 returnees are expected to debark from 13 ships today at six west coast ports, while 3,304 servicemen will arrive at New York aboard 10 vessels.

West coast arrivals include: San Francisco—13 ships with 12 men; San Diego, Calif. three ships with 2,736; Los Angeles, at least 1,495 aboard three vessels; Seattle—Wash. two transports, 2,768; Tacoma, Wash. three ships with 6,838; Portland, Ore. one vessel with 2,065.

Ships and units arriving: At New York—Loman Abbott from Marseille, 509 troops, including companies C, E, and L of 398th infantry regiment. Fitzhugh Lee from Antwerp, 573 troops, including medical detachments of 914th quartermaster truck company and 338th harbor craft company. John Brown from Marseille, 100th infantry division (due originally yesterday.)

Empress from Southampton, 445 troops, including 413th military police escort guard company; 3256th signal service company; 8th airforce members.
