

# Lima Films Run Drama to Comedy Gamut

## Ohio Features Stanwyck and Brent Picture

Variety is the spice of life and the same holds true in a motion picture. Lima's theatre marquee shows variety in its highest form this Sunday for the films have everything from drama to comedy and back again.

Focusing on that intangible element in a woman's heart that makes her love—or hate—the newest drama, "My Reputation," currently showing at the Ohio theatre, presents a timely love story of a woman who falls in love for the second time only to find herself no longer accepted by a smug playboy. Starring Barbara Stanwyck and featuring George Brent, the film recounts with clarity and understanding the path taken by a young woman left bewildered by the sudden death of her husband and faced with the task of finding happiness for herself and her two young sons.

Jealousy—the thing rears its green head on some of the most unexpected occasions—is the main theme for "Leave Her to Heaven," the film which is continuing a successful stay at the Quilna theatre.

The picture, which stars Gene Tierney, Cornel Wilde and Jeanne Crain, tells of a young girl who is so lost because she loves someone where else. Because she is of the type who wants to be loved as completely as she herself loves, she never finds happiness. The movie has a unique beginning and the ending is of an unusual nature. Some years ago, folks knew Dick Powell only by his voice. But he has become a figure of much more importance. He has changed his whole manner of acting and it has proved a delightful chance for both he and theatre audiences. Powell now plays the tough guy. Fans got a taste of it in "Murder, My Sweet," and Powell has come back with more in "Cornered." The latter film, currently showing at the Sigma, is packed with intrigue and carries a wallop that is as shocking as a bolt of thunder.

Two romances, connected only by the fact that each of the persons are spending a "Week-end at the Waldorf" is the thread of thought interwoven in the film of the same name currently showing at the State theatre. With Van Johnson, Lana Turner, Ginger Rogers and Walter Pidgeon, the picture has plenty of laughs for everyone plus a couple of the most tender romances ever filmed on celluloid. Sharing the billing is "Brighton Strangler" with John Loder. Vivian Austin is the pretty star of "Night, Club, Girl," the film which tells of the plight of a couple small town kids who try their luck at cracking into Hollywood and coming out with fame and fortune.
