

# 'People Are Funny' Film Opens For Run at Sigma Wednesday

### Luce May Seek Seat in Senate

WASHINGTON, Jan. 29—(INS) Congresswoman Clara Boothe Luce of Connecticut may run for the senate on the Republican ticket in this year's national election.

Mrs. Luce, now serving her third term as a member of the house of representatives, is being boomed for the job by friends who feel she could carry the Nutmeg state if she won the Republican nomination.

The race for the Connecticut senate seat was thrown wide open last week by the announcement of Sen. Thomas C. Hart, Republican, that he would not seek re-election because of his advancing years.

Should Mrs. Luce win the election, she would be the second woman in the history of the United States to be elected to the nation's highest legislative body. The only other woman to achieve such distinction was Mrs. Hattie Caraway (D) Ark., who was defeated for re-election in 1944 by Sen. William Fulbright.

Democrats in Connecticut, meanwhile, are actively discussing naming Eric Administrator Chester Bowles for the senate seat. Bowles may be drafted out of his federal post in an effort to gain the seat for the administration.

### Cline Actions Checked Further

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 29—(INS)—A few more pieces of the jigsaw puzzle activities of eight-times-married Alfred L. Cline were fitted together and carried back to San Francisco today by Deputy District Attorney Harding McGuire.

District Attorney Tom Handley of Multnomah-co will confer with McGuire again in about three weeks to determine "which state, if any, will proceed first" against Cline, who is a heavy charge while a nationwide investigation is made into the sudden deaths of Cline's wives.

McGuire now has visited Portland, Ore., Macon, Ga., and Dallas, Tex., and other places to assemble facts about the activities of Cline.

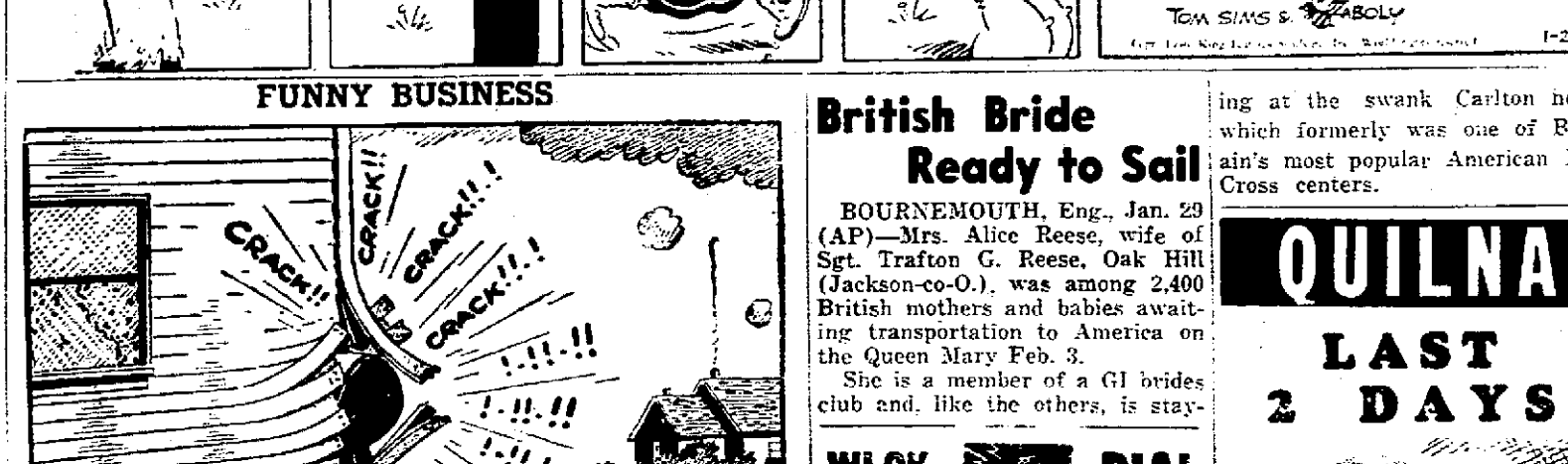
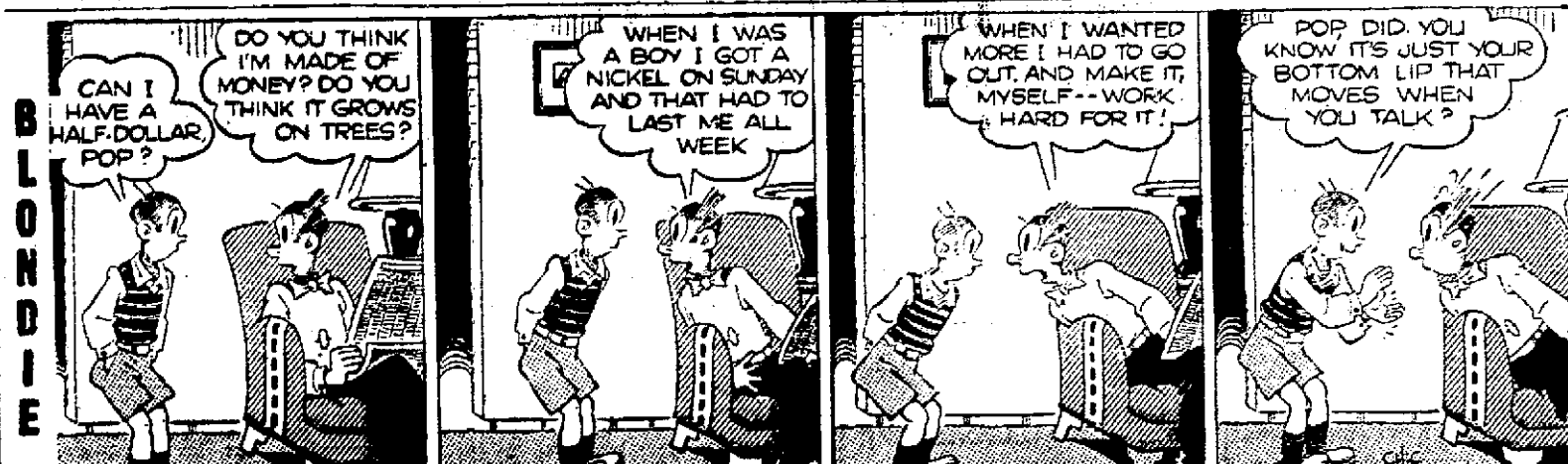
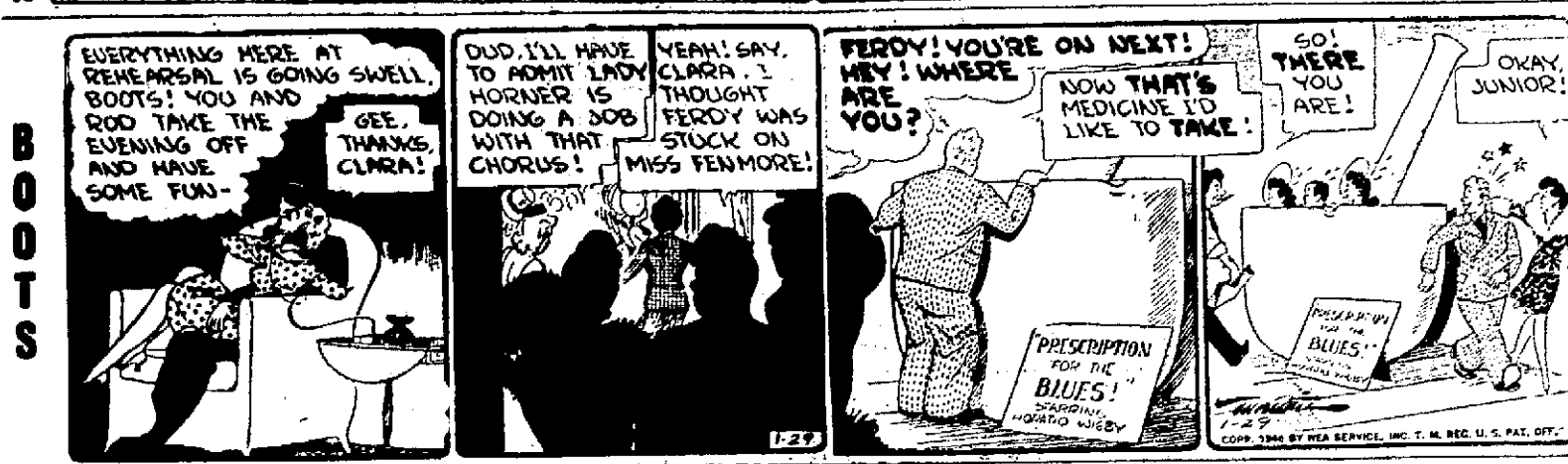
