## 2 Kenton Youths Together for 39 Months of War

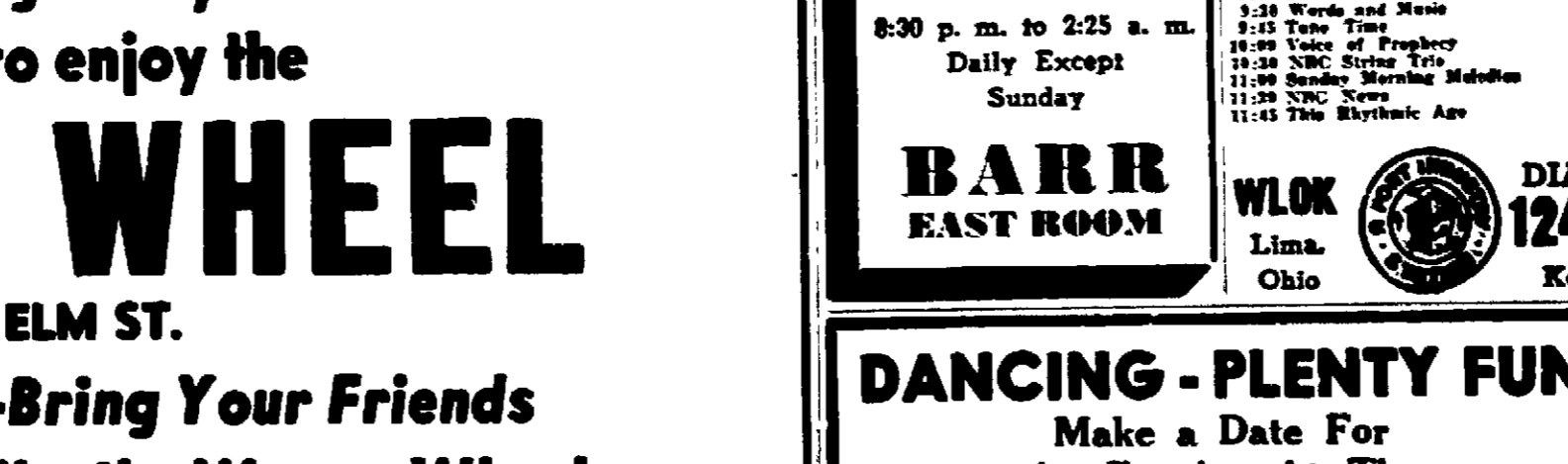
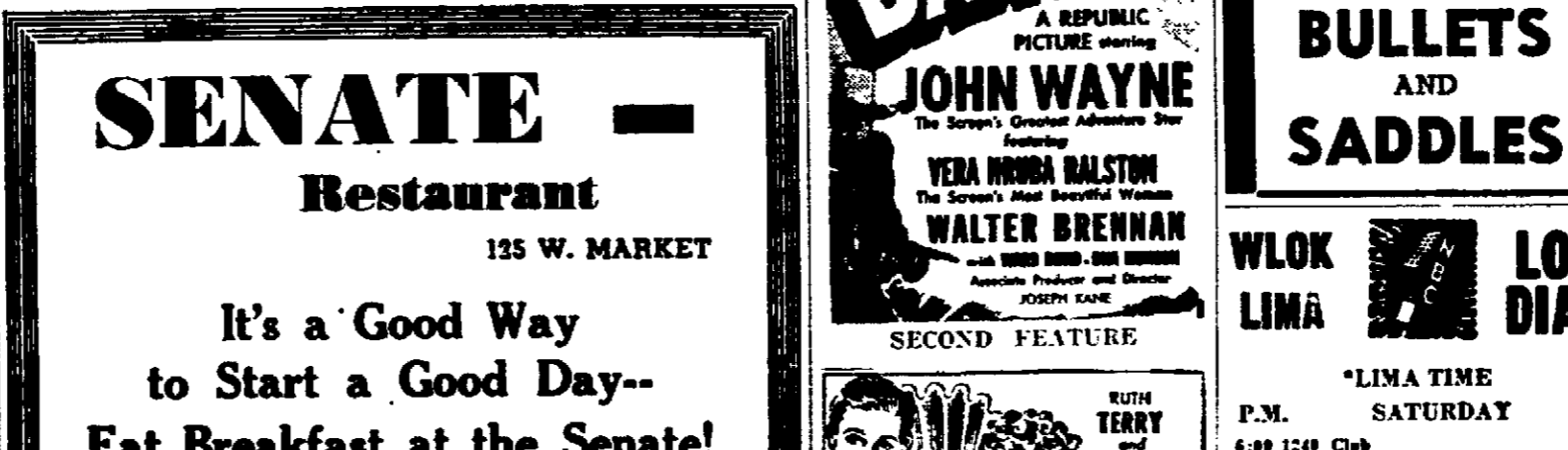
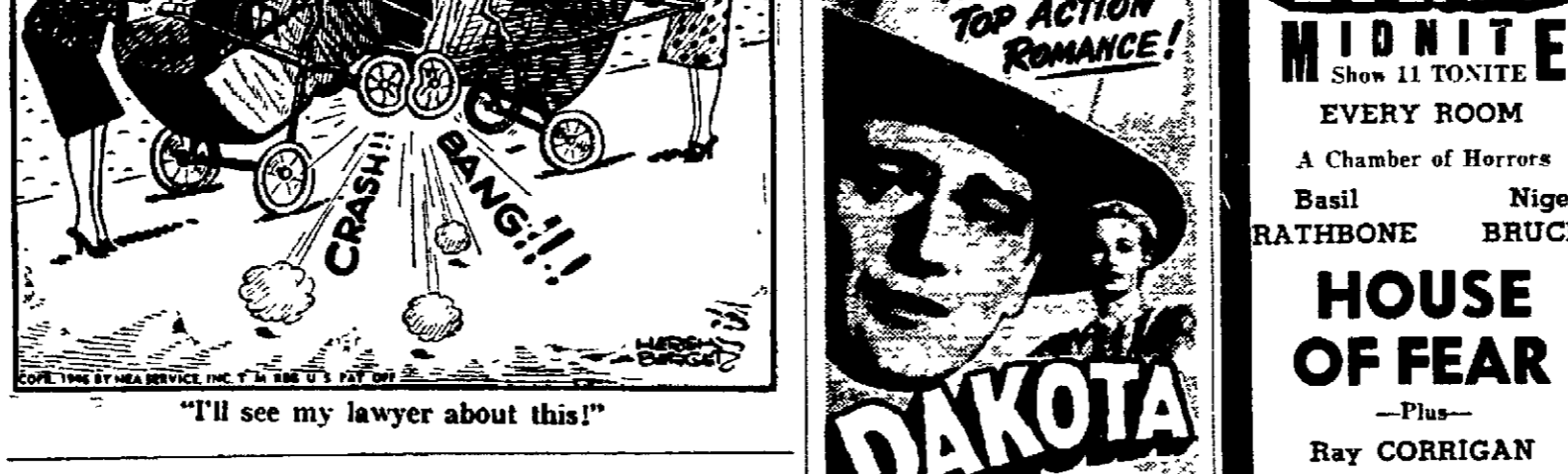
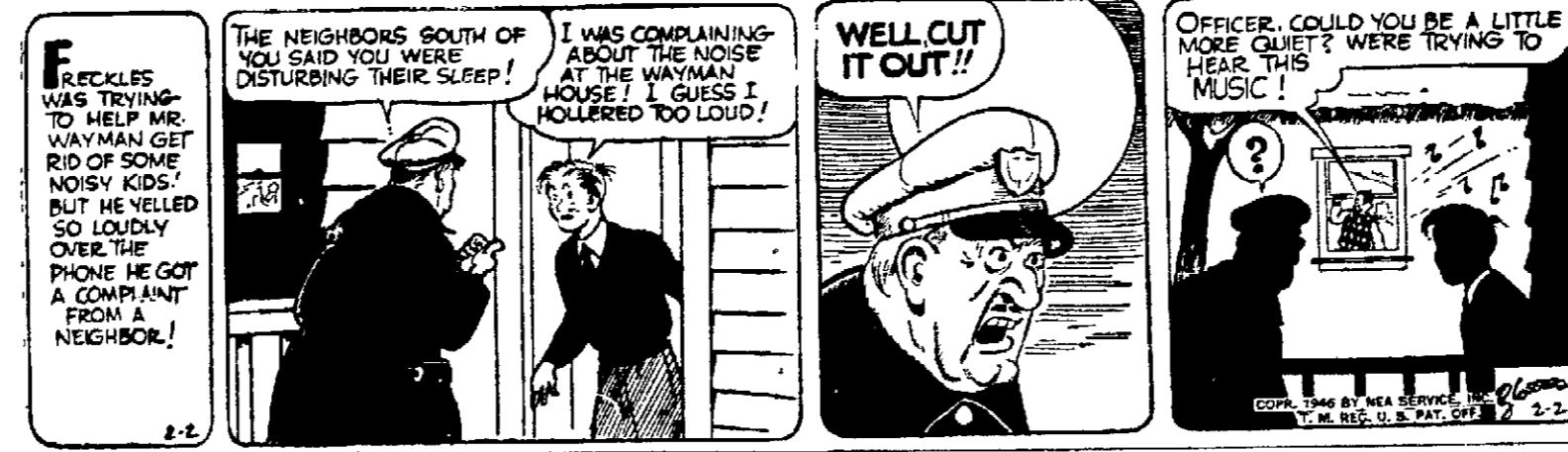
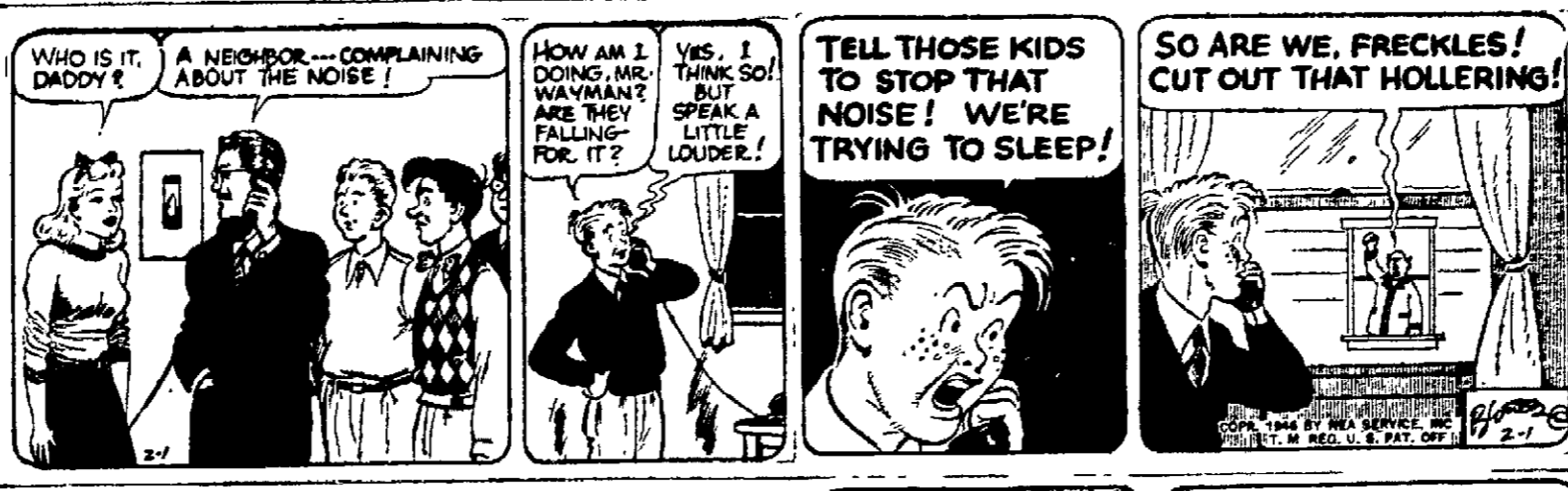

KENTON, Feb. 2.—Norman Wyndham and Sidney Wuethrich, both of Kenton, returned to their homes here recently after having spent the past 39 months in service, during which they never were separated, and shared their hardships as well as joys in the same company.

Leaving Kenton Oct. 1, 1942, and reporting to Ft. Hayes, Columbus, the two boys were sent to California for 13 months' training. From there they were shipped to Australia, where they spent four months. In New Guinea, the two Kenton young men, still together, served for eight months, and most recently were stationed in the Philippines for 14 months, where they served in the ordinance anti-aircraft division of the Army.

At the time of their discharges at Camp Atterbury, Ind., Wuethrich held the rank of technical sergeant, while Wyndham was a technical third grade.

## Bakery Strike Peace Sought

CINCINNATI, Feb. 2.—(INS)—Conciliation efforts to settle the strike of nearly 1,000 AFL bakers in Cincinnati will be resumed early next week.  
Daniel O'Connor, U. S. Conciliation Service commissioner, said today that union and company representatives have agreed to meet with him but have been unable to decide on a date.  
Fifteen Greater Cincinnati bakeries still are closed by the walk-out.  
A small Covington, Ky., shop resumed operations yesterday after signing a contract with the union.  
The workers are demanding a 30 per cent general increase for bakers and auxiliary workers.
