

# 'Harvey Girls' with Garland Makes Debut at Ohio Friday

Music, romance, laughter, drama and thrills are widely assorted components of the new technicolor entertainment, "The Harvey Girls" which will open at the Ohio theatre Friday with Judy Garland topping a star studded cast.

A filmusical vignette of pioneer New Mexico of the 1890's, with the saga of the famous eating houses established by Fred Harvey along the Santa Fe railroad as its theme, the plot has Miss Garland singing, dancing and even shooting her way into a battle royal between the forces of civic enlightenment and the saloon desperadoes who resort to an attempt to burn down the Harvey houses to gain their own nefarious ends.

You have a promise of a rare time at the Quilna theatre where Fred MacMurray is starring in "Pardon My Past" Fred's past is your laugh-laden present. He's loved by a girl he's never seen. He's pursued by a wife he'd never married and he's stalled by a killer he's never even been introduced to.

Co-starring with Faye Emerson, both players turn in a performance worth shouting about. Sharing the bill is "Pardon Us" with Laurel and Hardy.
