Some members predicted the committee would not approve the full year's training program recommended by President Truman. They believed some compromise would be reached.

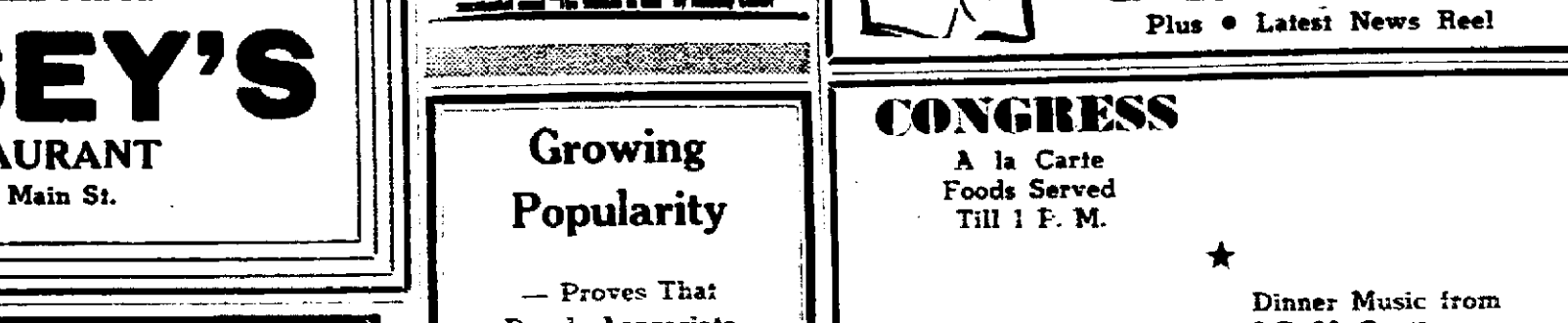
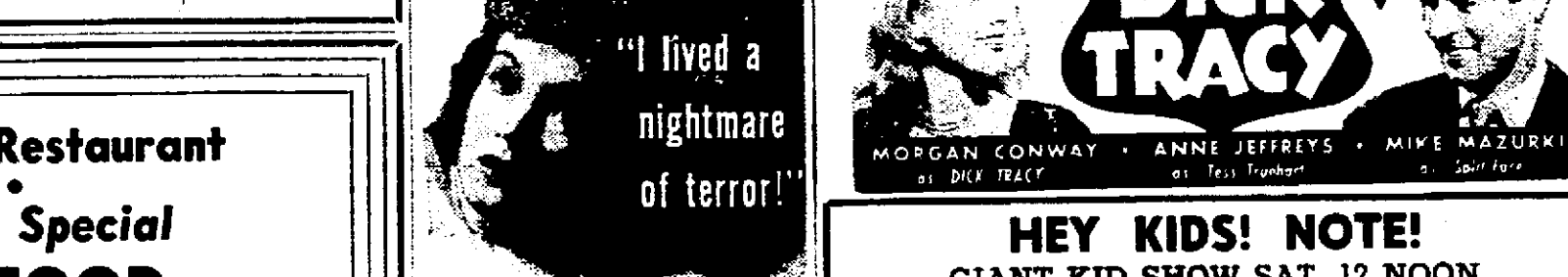
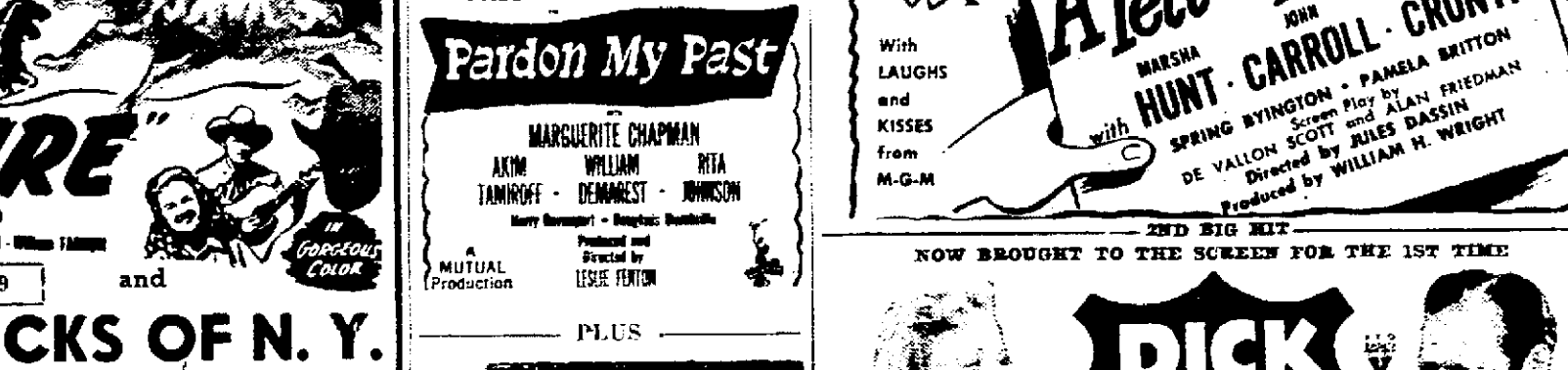
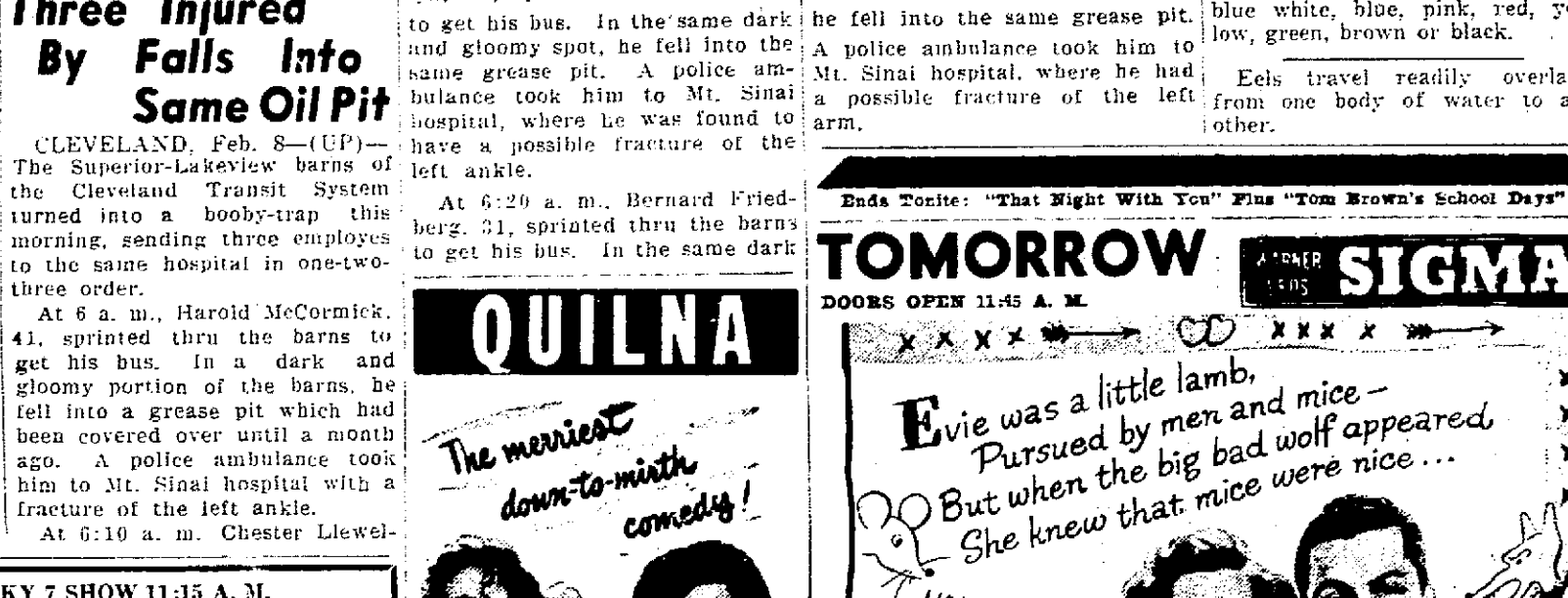
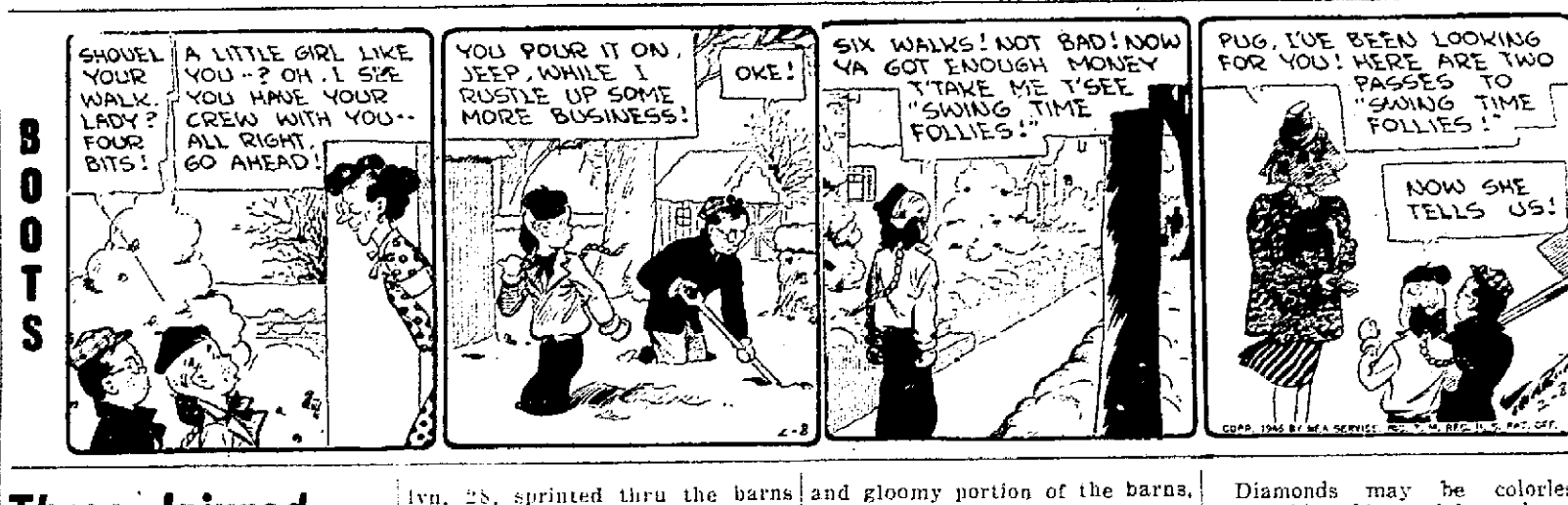
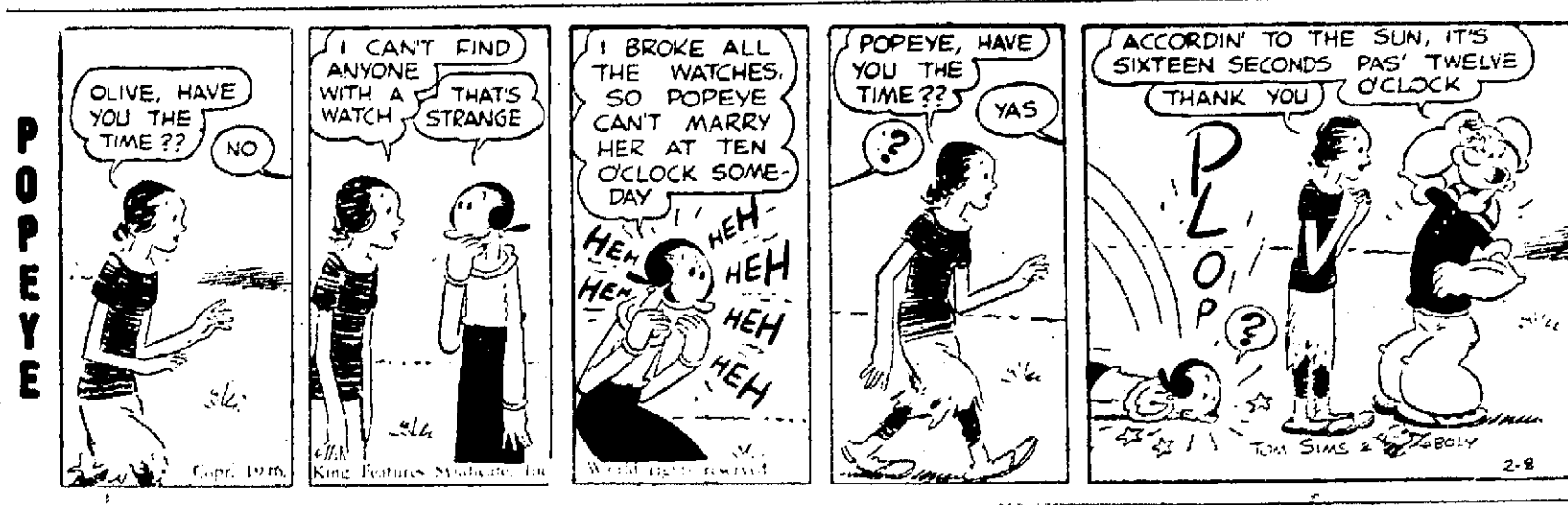
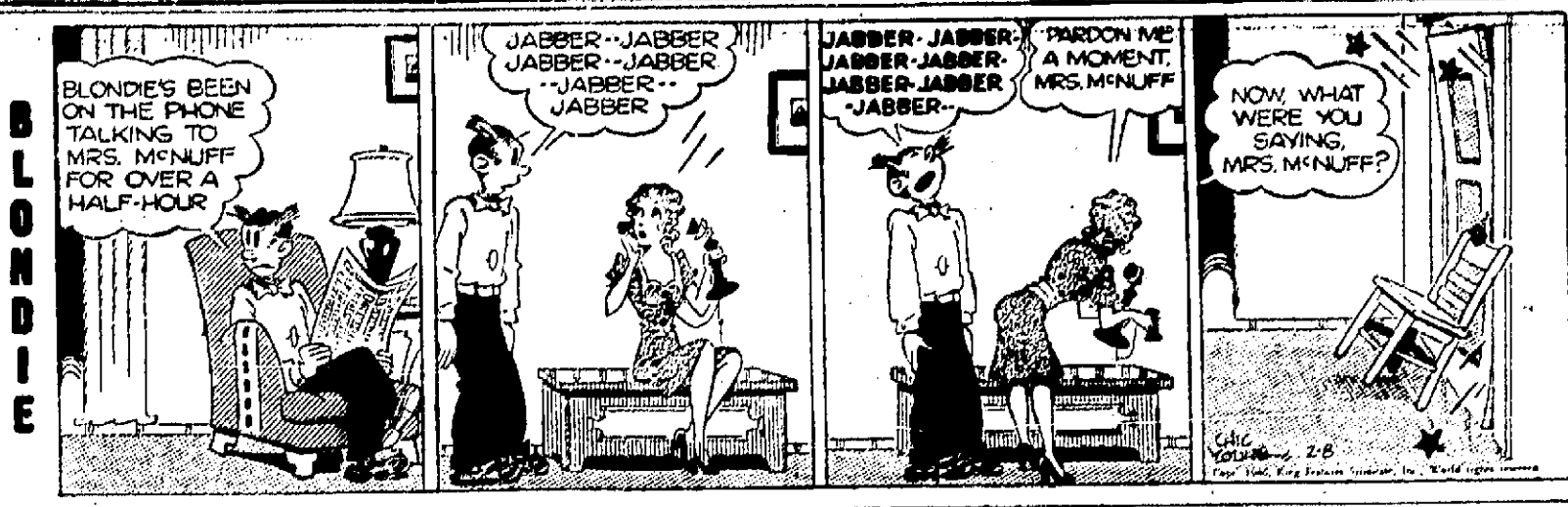
