

Music Highlights Films Scheduled for Sunday

'Harvey Girls' Depicts West Of Old Times

Music hath charm that soothes the savage beast, or so the old adage goes. It holds true in Lima theatres this Sabbath, however, for the show houses have musicals billed in the majority.

The story of expansion and move westward is told on a grand scale in the film "The Harvey Girls" with Judy Garland, John Hodiak and Marjorie Main. 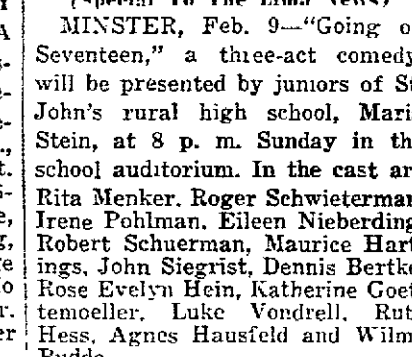
