# Says Germans Remain Defiant

LINCOLN, Neb., Feb. 14—(INS)—The Germans are "sullen, defiant, bitter, and far from beaten," Congresswoman Frances Bolton said today.

The Ohio congresswoman, recently returned from a trip to Germany, told women delegates to the Nebraska Republicans' founders day meeting:

"They write derogatory remarks about the Allies on their broken monuments, on the ruins of their unknown soldier monument was written in English: 'And still you think you have won.'"  
Congresswoman Bolton said "we must wipe out the bitterness and defiance in Germany thru our national strength."
