

Hilarious Bumstead Family On Quilna Theatre Screen

It's their newest screen adventure and all the popular members are present—Penny "Blondie" Singleton, Arthur "Dogwood" Lake, Larry "Alexander" Simms, Marjorie "Cookie" Hale and Daisy, too, with all her pups.

Storm Delays Arctic Trek

CHURCHILL, Man., Feb. 15—(AP)—The start of exercise musk-ox—an 81-day experimental military trek thru the trackless Arctic—was postponed until tomorrow because of a howling wind which swept the treeless wastes today with punishing 40-below-zero cold.

The ice wind, lapping up the worst weather of the winter in the north country, made it impossible to start the 4,100-mile overland trip at the scheduled time, 8:15 (9:15 EST) this morning. At Eskimo Point, 200 miles north of here, it was 50 below.

Surplus Swap For Air, Trade Rights Urged

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15—(UP)—Rep. Carter Manross, D. Ala., proposed today that the United States swap excess war supplies overseas for trade and aviation concessions in foreign countries.

He offered his suggestion as the house executive expenditures committee, which he heads, began hearings on the question of revising the surplus property act to speed disposal of goods and give veterans a better break.

Manross pointed out that under the present law, the State department must get either goods or foreign exchange for surplus goods disposed of abroad.

"I feel that we should broaden this exchange basis," he said. "There are a lot of countries which have neither the money nor the goods to trade for our surplus. Yet they sorely need these materials which we certainly are not bringing back to this country."

"I want to see incorporated into any bill we bring out authority for the State department to exchange our goods for various kinds of concessions—trade concessions, landing rights and embassy or legation sites."
