

Film Mixture on Theatre Bills for Lima Saturday

A mixture of films will greet movie-goers Saturday in the event that the urge to see a motion picture drives them out into the cold, blustery night air of winter.

The trials and tribulations of a newly-married couple provide laughter and poignant moments alike in "The Sailor Takes a Wife" which opened Saturday on the Sigma screen. With Robert Walker as the sailor and June Allyson as the wife, the picture tells the heart-warming story of the two falling in love at first sight after their meeting at a New York canteen.

"Thinking they have little time left, the couple is married by a justice of the peace and sets up housekeeping in an unfurnished brownstone apartment. Much to Walker's chagrin, he is given a medical discharge and finds himself looking for a job.

Currently playing at the Ohio theatre is the film, "Bells of St. Mary's" which stars Ingrid Bergman and Bing Crosby. With two such fine artists in the field of motion pictures, no one could possibly wish for more in a film.

When two players have both been voted the Academy Award for the best acting of a year, that's something. But when they are cast together, to be directed by a man who copped the award of the year for the best direction of a picture, that's really something.

Blondie and Dagwood hit the jackpot for fun in the latest film, "Life with Blondie" starring Arthur Luke and Penny Singleton and currently playing at the Quilna theatre. America's model family hilariously tangles with artists' models and gangsters in their newest escapade. The fun all starts when Daisy is elected "Pin-up Girl" of the Navy and becomes famous as a dog model but everything ends well despite the uproar in which the Bunstead house finds itself.

Robert Walker finds himself entangled in a series of idiotic instances in "What Next, Corporal Hargrove," the film which opened at the State theatre Saturday. Hargrove, portrayed by Walker, seems to manage to be the only GI who can involve himself in so many unusual situations and yet manage to come thru unscathed. Sharing the billing is "Captain Kidd" with Charles Laughton and Randolph Scott.

Some of the fastest moving comedy of a long while will come to the Lyric theatre Saturday mid-night in the form of "Penthouse Rhythm" with Kirby Grant. It's actually amazing how quickly things can happen, so he learns from the film now co-featured with "West of Pinto Basin."

Only one more day remains in the time to see "The Sullivans," the film which tells the story of the five young brothers who went down with their ship early in the war. Anne Baxter and Thomas Mitchell share the honors in this film now showing at the Allen theatre.

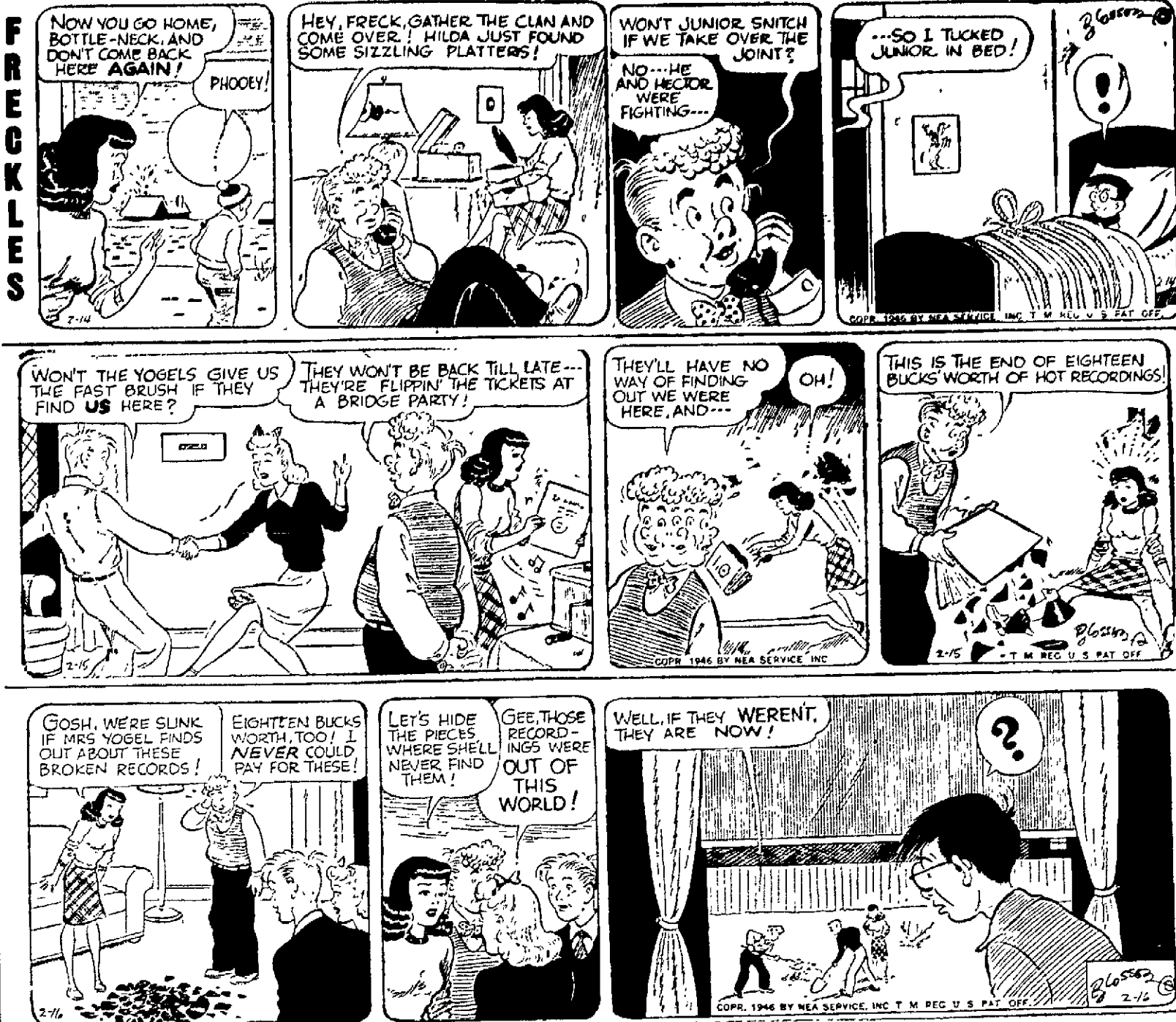

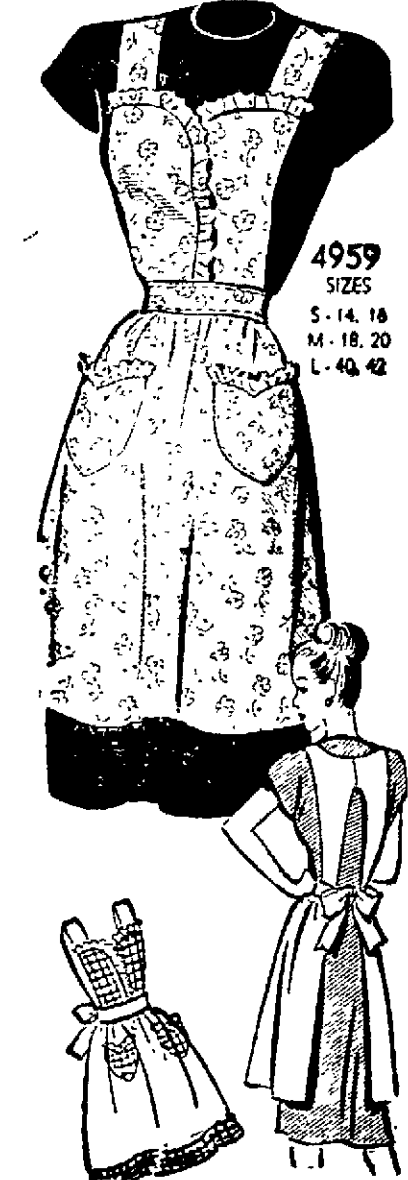

Urge Pay Boost For Pressmen

CINCINNATI, Feb. 16—(AP)—An arbitration board recommends weekly increases of \$14.02 for day and \$15.02 for night work in the wages of Cleveland newspaper pressmen, who ended a five-week strike Feb. 5 when their union and publishers agreed to arbitrate the wage dispute.

The work stoppage forced The Cleveland Plain Dealer, The Cleveland News and The Cleveland Press to suspend publication.

The decision of the board provided the increases would be retroactive to last Sept. 8, the expiration date of the pressmen's old contract, and held that "the same ratio on a percentage basis shall be applicable to apprentices and fly-boys."

The Cleveland Newspapers Publishers' assn had offered a \$10.86 boost over the \$53 weekly scale for day and night pressmen.

Dayton Murder Case Is Solved

DAYTON, Feb. 16—(INS)—Dayton police marked down as solved today the murder and robbery Feb. 2 of Grover C. Freeman, 61-year-old night watchman at a foundry.

Detective Capt. C. L. McElhaney said that Huth H. Colfield, 20, of Dayton, confessed that he struck Freeman with an iron pipe and brass knuckles before robbing him of his watch, wallet and gun. However, he overlooked a sum of money that the watchman had hidden in an inner pocket.
