

Picture at Sigma Theatre Held Over Until Saturday

The freshness, warmth and sympathetic qualities which have brought Robert Walker to the top since his first appearance as "Pvt. Hargrove" again are revealed in his new role as a medically-discharged sailor in "Sailor Takes a Wife," the film which is being held over a few more days at the Sigma theatre.

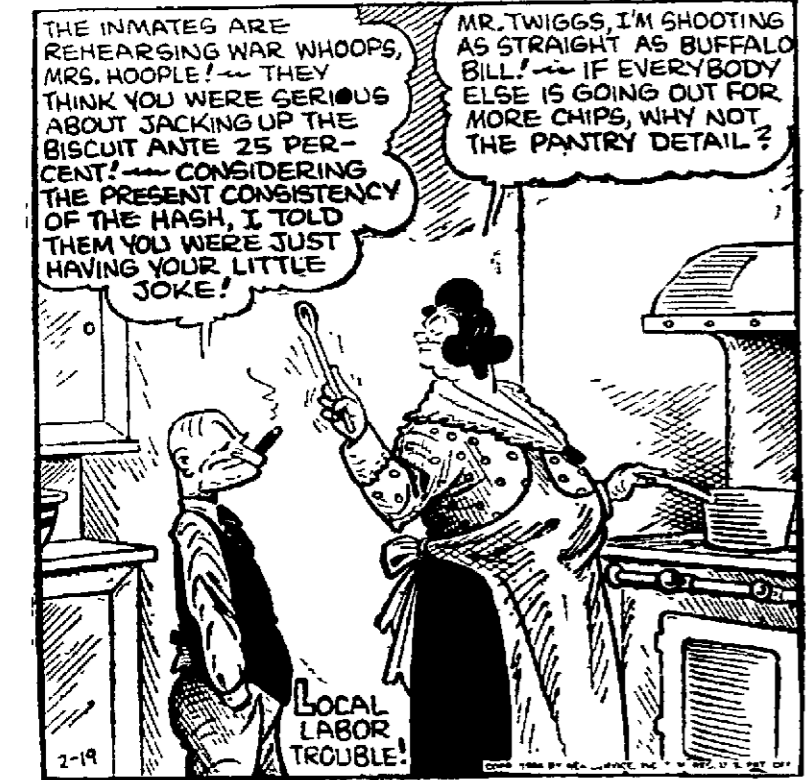
Columbus Ponders Pay Hike Demand

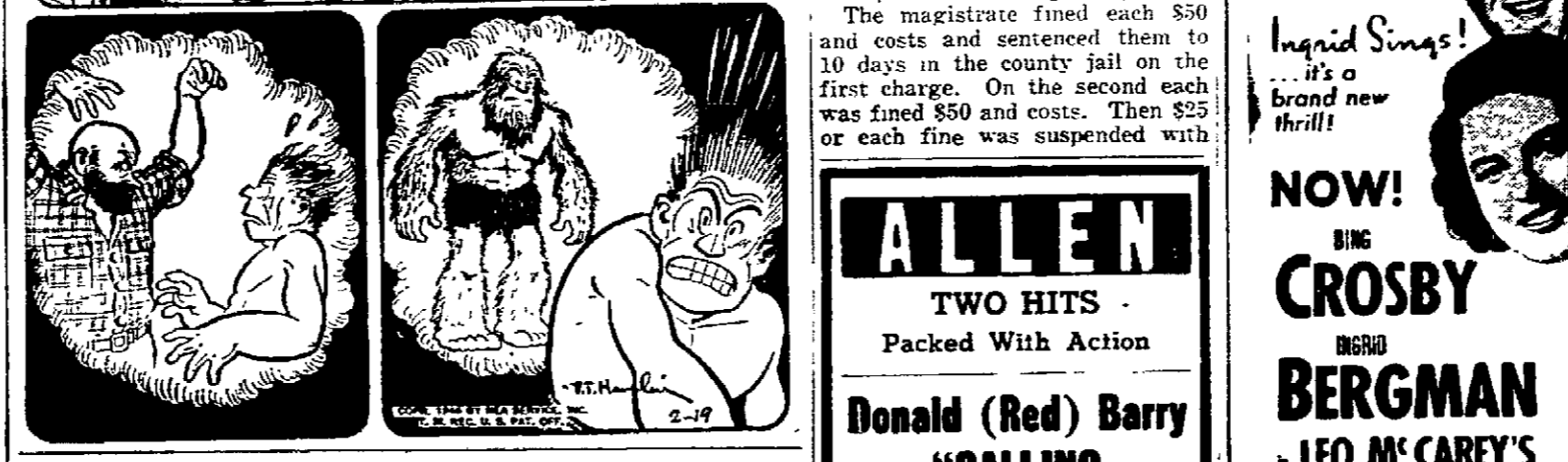

Three Leipsic Men Fined and Jailed

OTTAWA, Feb. 19—Three Leipsic men pleaded guilty to two charges each and were given fines and jail sentences by Justice of the Peace O. J. Schierloh here today.

Alfred Butler, Junior Butler and Charles Barton were the defendants. They were charged with resisting Marshal Harold Wank of Leipsic and with assault and battery on Louis Kaufman of Leipsic during an altercation in a Leipsic beer parlor a few nights ago.

The magistrate fined each \$50 and costs and sentenced them to 10 days in the county jail on the first charge. On the second each was fined \$50 and costs. Then \$25 or each fine was suspended with the provision that the men maintain good behavior when they get out of jail.
