

New and Different Film Billed For State Theatre Wednesday

Something different in the line of crime stories which have been holding the film spotlight for the past couple years has opened at the State theatre in the form of "Girl on the Spot" with Lois Collier and Jess Barker sharing the stellar honors.

No, it's not a mystery yarn, far be it from the kind of which you are thinking. You see the murder he committed and you don't have to guess who did it. Yet, your sleuthing abilities are tested when you go on the manhunt with the characters of the show.

The plot concerns the fortunes of a light opera company and details their transmission from singing waiters to the big league overture performers. The status of the singing waiters is made evident as the plight of performers who operate a restaurant merely as an interlude between theatre engagements.

The killers become involved with these talented folk when the head gangster, a dyed-in-the-wool music lover, can't restrain his weakness for Gilbert and Sullivan melodies.

With only a few days left in the time to see "Bells of St. Mary's" the picture currently showing at the Ohio theatre, here's one reviewer who wants to remind you that you are missing something unless you see this outstanding film.

With Bing Crosby and Ingrid Bergman in the starring role, the film has one of the most beautiful stories ever to be incorporated in a screen production.

A thundering spectacle of love and adventure storming onto the screen of the Quilna theatre is the film "The Fighting Guardsman" an adaptation from Alexander Dumas' stirring novel, "The Companions of Jehu."

Film fans who go for costume pictures filled with swashbuckling action, flashing swordplay and tender romance, and what one doesn't, are promised complete satisfaction at the screen adaptation of this well-known masterpiece.
