

'Scarlet Street' To Open At Ohio Theatre Friday

Every once in a while Hollywood comes thru with a surprise picture which has audiences clutching at the edge of theatre seats. Such a film is the recent release "Scarlet Street," which will open at the Ohio theatre Friday.

It shouldn't be called a mere film for it is an outstanding cinema in every respect. Edward G. Robinson, Joan Bennett and Dan Duryea have the title roles and Robinson is excellent. Playing another graphic role, as a painter, the part is certain to win him added audience attention.

Miss Bennett is at her best as a teacherous beauty who can sneer at any man but Duryea. The latter does his finest acting job to date, coming thru with a performance that makes him certain star timber.

All the thrills, pageantry and intrigue of Alexandre Dumas' immortal novel, "The Companions of Jehu" have been brought to the screen magnificently in the film "The Fighting Guardsman," now showing at the Quilna theatre.

Set in 18th century France, the film tells the story of a young nobleman, who flings aside his birthright and becomes an outlaw, to bring about the downfall of a tyrannical king and the system of injustice and inequality which was so hateful to freedom-loving persons everywhere.

With a small band of patriotic peasants, he robs the royal mail coaches and turns over to needy, cases of gold which had been extorted from a helpless citizenry.

Robert Walker and June Allyson continue to give audiences a laugh in the film "Sailor Takes a Wife," currently showing at the Sigma theatre. All the trials of the first few days of marriage, which nearly every young couple has experienced before becoming accustomed to each other, are shown amusingly, and in some cases, hilariously, and poignantly in this film.

Sharing the billing is "Boston Blackie's Rendezvous" with Chester Morris as the featured actor. No, it's not a "whodunit," it's one of the strangest mysteries this reviewer ever had the occasion to witness. It's the film "Girl on the Spot," now showing at the State theatre. The crime is committed before the eyes of the theatre audience yet no one in the movie knows how or when or by whom the crime was committed.

It's a startling new idea woven into a film which will bring you to attention the minute it begins its stint on the screen.

Joan Davis may be seen Friday at the Lyric theatre in one of her funniest roles to date. In the film, "She Gets Her Man," the comedienne is at her best. The manners she uses in this comedy feature far surpass anything audiences have witnessed in the line of her type of comedy. Sharing the billing will be "Lost Trail."
