

# Good Films Grace Marquees Of Lima Theatres Saturday

A host of good films are to be found on Lima's theatre marquees this Saturday, one of which is so good that it has been held over.

At the Ohio theatre is the stirring mystery film "Scarlet Street" which stars Edward G. Robinson, Joan Bennett and Dan Duruya. The film tells the story of a cashier in a large firm who in his attempts to find something he thought was lost forever, embezzles funds and commits murder. Thrilling is not the word to describe the picture because it is more than that, it's outstanding.

Vivian Blaine and Dennis O'Keefe turn in top performances along with Perry Como, a newcomer to the screen, and Carmen Miranda in "Doll Face." The picture tells the story of a burlesque performer who wants a legitimate career in the "theatrical" but because of her present occupation, "is not acknowledged as potential stage material. Sharing the billing is "Voice of the Whistler" with Richard Dix.

"Bells of St. Mary's" luckily for everyone, has been held over a few more days at the Sigma theatre. The film tells the story of a parochial school threatened by the fact that the structure may be torn down to make way for a parking lot for a huge office building. Because of popular demand, the film was brought over from the Ohio theatre to the Sigma, thus allowing a few more days for fans to see the picture.

James Craig and Frances Gifford go to the races in "She Went to the Races" the film now playing at the State theatre. The film tells of a group of scientists who believed they can beat the ponies merely by scientific means and from the looks of things, they seem to do pretty well until the wagers get mixed up and are put on the wrong horse.

Charles Starrett will be seen beginning Saturday midnight in a film just recently released for the pleasure of western fans. The film is "Frontier Outlaw" and affords plenty of action for those who like things fast and daring.

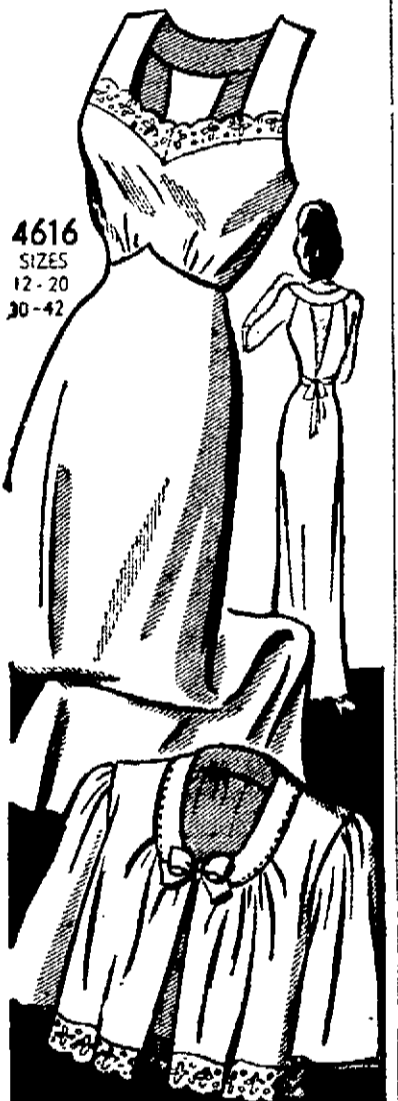

## Republicans Map Campaign

SALT LAKE CITY, Feb. 23—(UP)—Republicans from 11 western states met today to plan their 1946 congressional campaign.

The chairman of the western Republican division, beginning a two-day regional conference here today, predicted that the GOP would win a majority in congress this fall.

Ezra Whitla, national committee man from Idaho and a veteran GOP leader, asserted that the chances were excellent of winning the necessary 36 seats—27 in the house and nine in the senate—to regain a congressional majority.

"The only hope of solving the problems confronting the west," Whitla said, "is in the Republican party securing control of congress. That's what we hope to do here. Unify for victory—and to consider problems particularly applicable to the western territories and industries."
