Become 'Conservative' Party, Kelland Urges Western GOP

SALT LAKE CITY (U.P.) - Author Clarence Budington Kelland urged western Republicans Friday to change themselves members of "the conservative party of America, in opposition to the Democratic or radical party of America." Kelland spoke to a conference of 200 Republican leaders from the 11 western states and Alaska, who met to plan election campaign strategy. Admitting that Republicans had been "getting what we deserved" a good, sound thrashing in elections for the last 19 years, Kelland said the GOP had lost because it "lacked courage and integrity and compromised with what it knew to be bad." "GOP Failed to Challenge" Kelland, who is the national Republican committeeman from Arizona, charged that the Democratic party had followed a "line of extreme, wild-eyed, unbridled radicalism, without regard to the decedent Europe." The Republican party has failed to challenge this position," he said. "It has failed to choose leaders who dared to challenge this position. In our last two presidential elections we have nominated candidates who have gyrated about the country... saying if you elect me I promise to do the same things as the Democrats but I'll make a better job of it." Kelland said that if the Republicans are to recover, they must recognize that the great issue upon which the destiny of this country now hangs is the issue between wild-eyed, irresponsible, extreme radicalism and decent, prudent conservatism.
