Injunction Plan Rapped by CIO

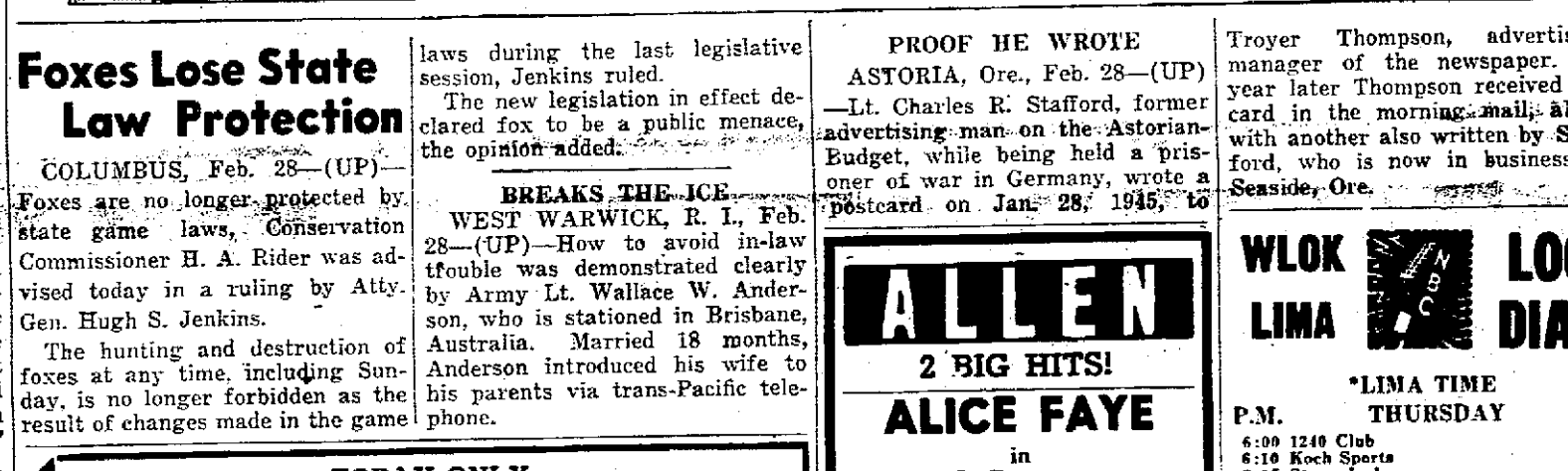
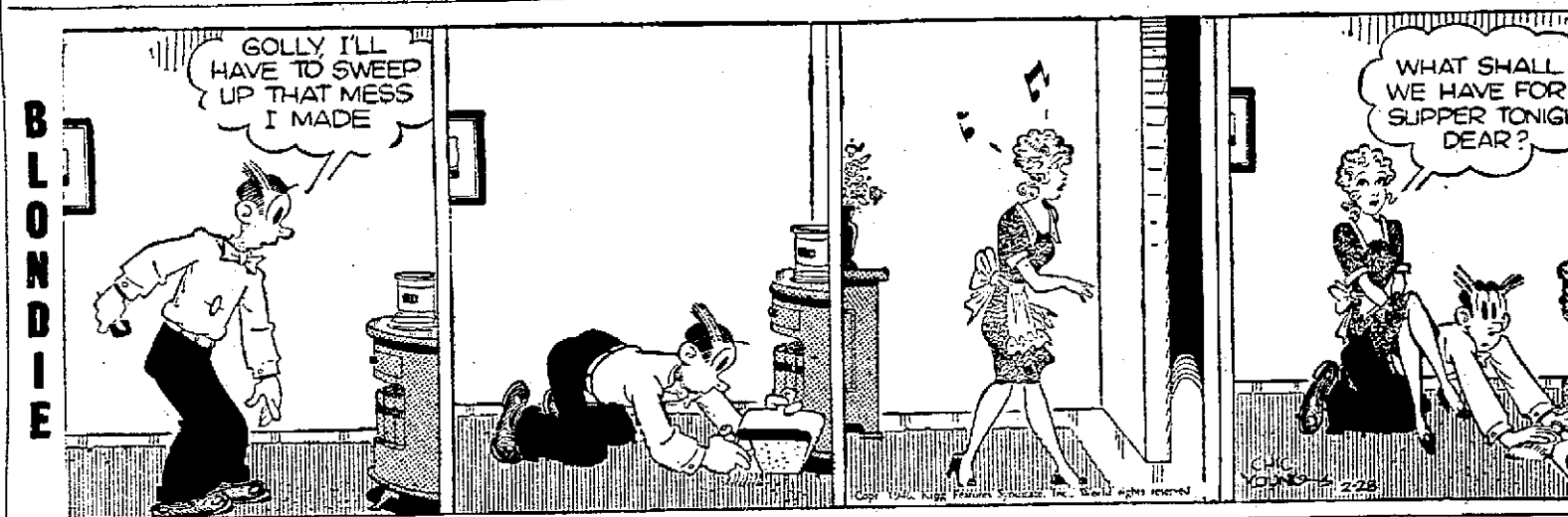
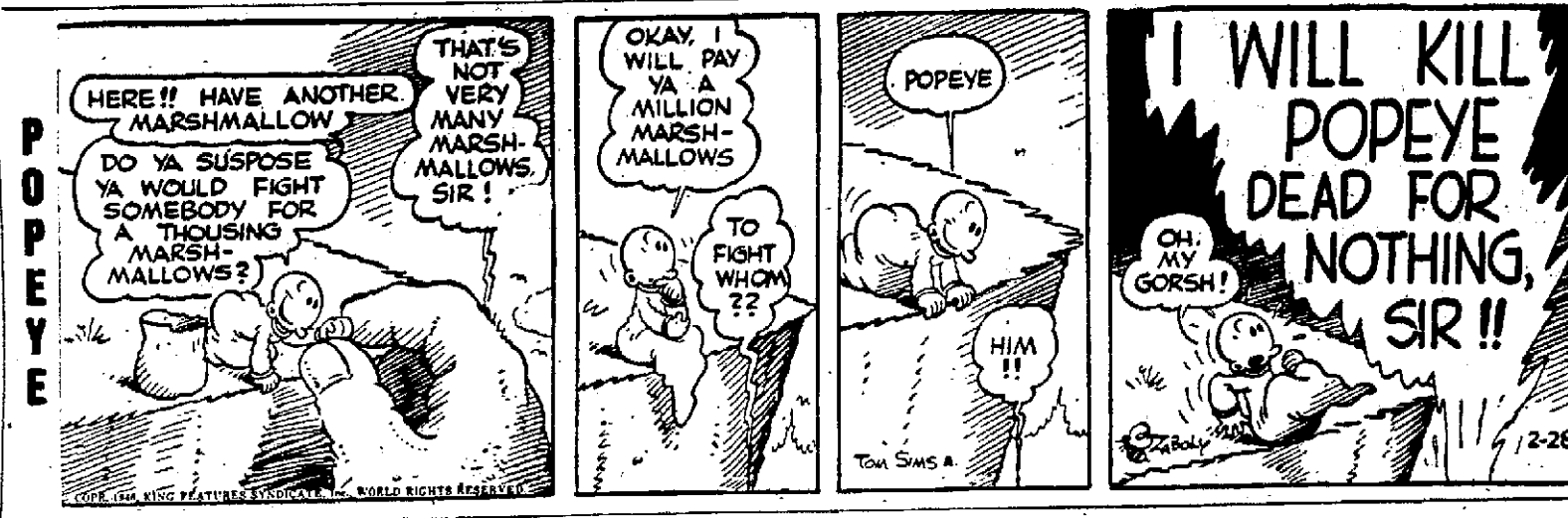
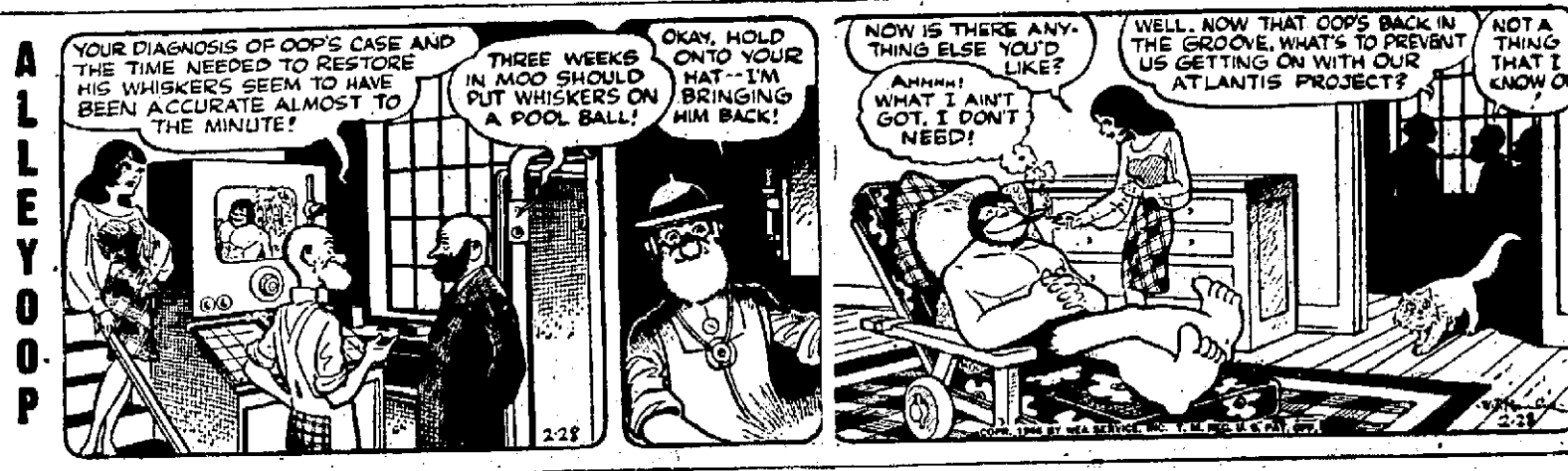
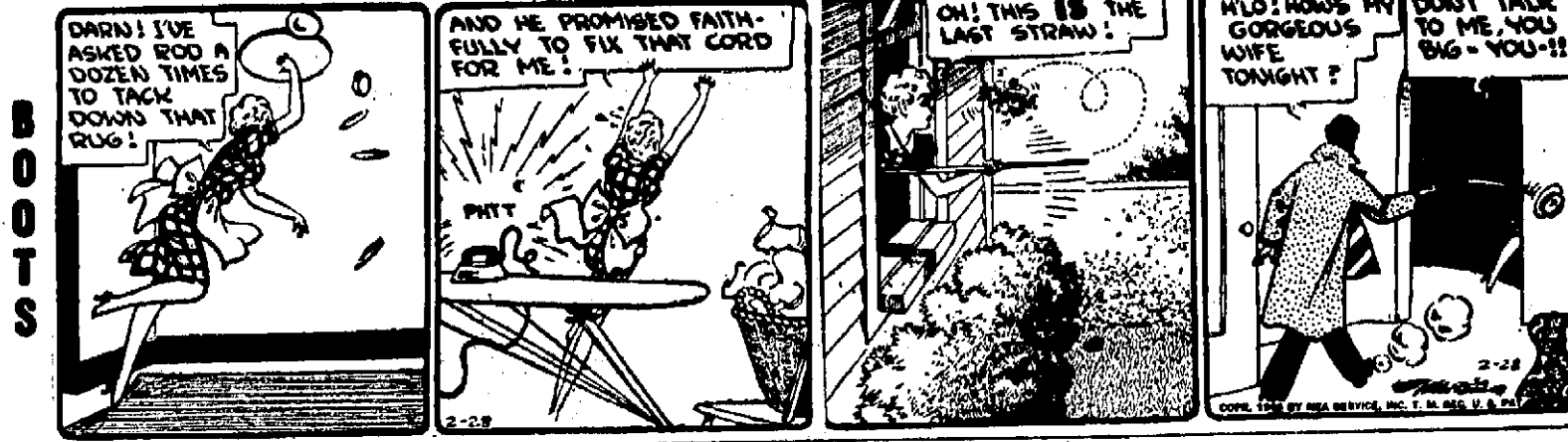
