Convicts Quiet After Strike

BOSTON, Mar. 2—(UP)—Convicts returned to their jobs under a unique collective bargaining proposal today after a rebellious day-long sitdown strike at the state prison at Charlestown in protest against "poor food" and parole board discrimination.

All available guards manned riot stations and 245 heavily-armed police reinforcements converged on the prison yesterday when all 568 of the long-term convicts refused to work until they were given an opportunity to talk with Massachusetts Correction Commissioner J. Paul Doyle.

After listening to the principal grievances of the convicts, Doyle offered to act as their go-between with Gov. Maurice J. Tobin and agreed to meet today with a 12-man convict committee on grievances.

The two brotherhoods, representing some 300,000 workers, withdrew from mediation with the railroads after refusal of the companies to consider the union demands that changes in some 45 operational rules be considered along with their demand for a 25 per cent wage increase.
