## Gags Galore Help to Spice Program Here

The theatres of Lima are loaded with gags and plenty of laughs for week-end entertainment.

One of the more amusing movies this reviewer has witnessed in some time is one at the Ohio theatre, "Guest Wife," with Don Ameche, Claudette Colbert and Dick Foran. ## Truman Party To Set Record

WASHINGTON, Mar. 2—(AP)—The largest party ever to accompany President Truman on tour will entrain with the chief executive and former Prime Minister Churchill when they leave here Monday afternoon for Fulton, Mo. Churchill will speak at Westminster college there Tuesday.

Nearly 100 persons will be on the train, including those who will board it en route.

The entourage will include 30 news writers, 13 radio men, 10 newsreel men, four still photographers and three communications men, in addition to the Truman and Churchill staffs and secret service agent.

Churchill is due to arrive here tomorrow morning from Miami Beach, Fla., where he has been vacationing. He is scheduled to leave his train at 9:30 a. m. to go to the British embassy. He will remain there until a White House car calls for him at 1:30 p. m. Monday to take him to the White House for a drive to the depot.

In Churchill's party will be Charles Campbell, British embassy information officer, Col. Frank Clark, Churchill's Florida host, and Inspector Williams of Scotland Yard. The President will have in his immediate party Adm. William D. Leahy, personal chief of staff, Secretaries Matthew J. Connelly and Charles G. Ross; Brig. Gen. Harry H. Vaughan, military aide; Capt. Clark Clifford, naval aide; Col. Wallace H. Graham, personal physician; Leonard Reinsch, radio advisor; John R. Green and Ted Marks, of Kansas City, friends who will board the train at St. Louis and White House communications and stenographic aides.
