Hospital Deal Path Is Cleared

WASHINGTON, Mar. 6—(INS)—Gov. Frank Lausche announced today that Ohio has been cleared for the state of Ohio to negotiate for purchase of the Fletcher General hospital, an Army installation, at Cambridge, O.

After conferring with the War Assets Corporation, Lausche told reporters that the Veterans Administration has officially notified the Army it cannot make use of the 2,500 bed hospital and that Ohio now stands next on the priority list to acquire the institution.

Lausche conferred with George E. Fuller, deputy administrator of the War Assets Corporation, the selling agency.

The governor said he advised Fuller that Ohio is prepared to negotiate for purchase of the hospital which is to be vacated not later than Mar. 20. An appraisal has been ordered and all equipment in the institution has been frozen, Lausche said.
