

Cinderella Comes to Life In Ohio Film Here Friday

The fable of Cinderella's glass slipper and pumpkin coach has been read and adored by every generation down through the years. But it remained for motion pictures to discover its winsome appeal and to transform it into a modern, streamlined romantic comedy.

In the form of "Cinderella Jones," which stars Joan Leslie and Robert Alda, opening at the Ohio theatre Friday, the film lives up to every romantic promise in the original fairy tale and adds a number of modern touches as well.

The film traces the whirlwind adventures of one Judy Jones, played by Joan Leslie, who discovers at separate moments, but with equally devastating effects, that she has been graced not only with youth and beauty, but with \$10,000,000 to boot. As the beauty long has been a part of the Jones' family assets, it is the \$10,000,000 that snaps Judy out of her blissful world of ballad singing with Tommy Coles' orchestra.

Daughter Tells Mrs. Vanderbilt To Go Get a Job

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 14—(UP)—

Gloria Vanderbilt Stokowski said today she would use her wealth to give the unfortunate children of the world some of the childhood happiness she was denied, and bluntly told her socialite mother to go find a job.

Her mother, Mrs. Gloria Morgan Vanderbilt, can work or starve, she said.

Mrs. Stokowski said, however, that as long as any of her \$4,000,000 remained, she would support her grandmother, Mrs. Gloria Vanderbilt, and that her for-

mer nurse, Emma Sullivan Keislich, need never know want.

The 22-year-old heiress denied angrily that her 64-year-old husband, Symphony Director Leopold Stokowski, had exercised "undue influence on her as her mother charged this week in New York.

Mrs. Vanderbilt said she was selling her jewelry because her daughter had suddenly reneged on a promise to pay her \$21,000 a year when she became of age and received her full inheritance.

"The money my mother wants is now going to blind children and to help feed children who are homeless and starving in many countries," she said. "I have formed a foundation which already is operating."
