

Cornel Wilde Has Star Billing In Current Lyric Attraction

Taking one back to the land of fairy tales seems to be the chief aim of the movies scheduled this week, one in particular opening at the Lyric theatre.

Jewish Refugee Quota Boosted

JERUSALEM, Mar. 18.—(INS) —The Palestine government has announced a new immigration quota which will permit the entry of a hundred non-Jewish refugees as well as the usual 3,500 Jews in the month ending Apr. 15.

Two American engineers, James B. Hays and J. L. Savage, told the Anglo-American Inquiry Commission that Palestine could absorb a million and a half more people if a two hundred and forty million dollar power plan was carried out in the Jordan valley.
