# RAPID PROGRESS TENNESSEE

TVA Chief Explains Rate of Advancement toward Improved Condition

CLEVELAND, Mar. 23—(AP)— The Tennessee Valley region has made more rapid progress economically since 1933 than the entire country. David E. Lilienthal, chairman of the Tennessee Valley Authority, declared today.

"By this I do not mean that the Tennessee Valley region is not still a region of low income, the TVA executive said in an address pre pared for delivery before the Cleveland City club.

"That is strikingly true when a comparison is made either with the average of the country as a whole with such wealthy states as Ohio and other industrial states, I am referring to rate of change, rate of progress toward an improved economic condition when I say that this one region has progressed more rapidly than the country as a whole did, and more rapidly in terms of income per person than any region of the United States.'

Organization of the TVA was an experiment. Lilienthal declared, because for the first time in American history a public body was given a unified responsibility to see that in one particular area the total job was done, to look at the opportunities of water and soil and forests and men as one problem interrelated, indivisible, unified.

The basic principle of TVAthe principle which distinguishes it today from all other agencies of the federal government-is that its character and its organization recognize this unity of nature," he

"The TVA also has had and continues to have its share of vague denunciation and cussing." Lilienthal asserted "But people are making up their own minds about it. There is now going on a silly campaign to smear the Tennessee Valley region, to picture it as under the 'domination' of the TVA; and all the old bromides Soviets Promise about socialism, enslavement. totalitarianism, etc., are being plastered all over the country.

This picture of the Tennessee pens that nowhere will you find a more independent kind of people than in that valley."

Hirshfield, Cleveland district Coast Guard of ficer, denied reports today that any life boat stations in the Great Lakes would be abandoned because of lack of personnel to man them. will be needed to operate the dis-
