

# 'Abilene Town' Film To Stay At Sigma Three More Days

Continuing its stay at the Sigma theatre is the roaring western, "Abilene Town" with Randolph Scott and Ann Dvorak. The film has its setting against the colorful background of the city of Abilene, Kans., as it was back in the pioneer years just after the Civil War.

It depicts the violent feuds between the arrogant cattle barons of the period who strove in high-handed fashion to keep the steadily arriving homesteaders from settling in the community.

Excitement still reigns high at the Ohio theatre where "Spiral Staircase," starring Dorothy McGuire, George Brent and Ethel Barrymore, is currently showing. Packed with suspense, the film tells the story of a maniacal killer who preys on girls who in some way are not normal.

Betty Grable and June Haver are receiving resounding applause for their performance in "Dolly Sisters," currently showing at the theatre. John Payne is cast with them in the film. Sharing the billing is "In the Meantime, Darling" with Jeanne Crain and Frank Latimore.

### Your GI Rights

Questions and Answers on Servicemen's Problems

WASHINGTON, Mar. 26.—(NEA)—Here are some general questions from veterans and their relatives about GI rights:

Q—My son is in his freshman year in college, with his expenses paid for by the government. The last two reports of his grades have been had. If he fails to pass any studies, will that affect his being able to remain in school?

A—He will have to make passing grades in order to continue receiving his allowance from the Veterans' Administration. Whether the college would let him continue is up to the school officials.

Q—My husband and another veteran went into business on a government loan. Now the other fellow wants to pull out and take a job. Is there any law compelling him to keep working with my husband?

A—No. His only legal obligation is to keep up payments on his part of the loan.

Q—The man who owns the house I live in is a veteran just returned from overseas. He wants me to get out so he can move in.

But my husband is overseas now. Can he force me to move?

A—If you can't settle your difficulty any other way, it will eventually be up to a local judge to decide whether or not you can be evicted.

Q—Is it possible for a veteran to go to a barber's college at government expense?

A—Yes, if the school is accredited by the state.

Q—My husband is in the ice business, but he has a chance to buy into a grocery concern. He is a veteran. Can he get a guaranteed loan to do it?

A—Probably not, because the law says a veteran has to take a full-time, active part in any business he gets a guaranteed loan to enter.

Q—Do former WACs have priority for the purchase of surplus property?

A—Yes, if they meet the other qualifications.
