



Claims Double

Coal Industry

CHARLESTON, W. Va., Mar. 29-(UP)-The coal industry is paying "double the amount paid by competitive industries in providing social security for its employes," Jesse V. Sullivan, secretary of the West Virginia Coalassn asserted in answer to demands of the United Mine Workers for a "common welfare fund" to be maintained by a royalty on each ton of coal mined by them.

In a prepared statement, Sullivan said "it is doubtful if the states or federal government would permit any one man or single organization to control a fund of

such aggregate . . . He added that the coal industry already made a greater contribution for social security for its employes than any other industry and pointed out that the "average labor cost of producing a ton of coal in West Virginia currently exceeds \$2. The labor cost of producing the equivalent of a ton of coal in the natural gas and oil industries was less than 50 per cent of this amount . . .

Sullivan continued, "the labor costs in the coal industry exceeded 60 per cent of the value of production and the coal payroll in West Virginia in the last fiscal year exceeded \$300,000,000 The social security tax on that payroll approximated \$7,500,000.


