WASHINGTON—Sen. Homer E. Capehart, the Indiana jockey box king, stuck out his not inconsiderable neck today and predicted that if the government gets built all the houses it wants, prices of same will collapse like a paper screen in a wind.

That's all right with me, Sen. Capehart said (and you should have seen the smiles spread over the spectators' faces) that if 2,700,000 houses are actually being built by next year, the war veterans' CAPEHART would cause so much production of everything from shingles to sinks that costs would drop at least 25 per cent.

"Not only will the cost of everything which goes into a house fall by one quarter, but the finished houses will drop that much in price, too," he said.

### Three Censured in Diabetic's Death

CHICAGO (U.P.)—Two detectives have been suspended and a police matron discharged in the death of a woman diabetic who was arrested as a drunk, Police Commissioner John C. Pendergast said today.

The detectives, William Geisler and Henry Hanson, received a five-day suspension, Pendergast said. The matron, Mrs. Verma E. Rasmussen, temporary employee in the woman's locker, Chicago, died in County hospital the day after the detectives found her in the street and locked her up. A card in her purse identified her as a diabetic, and physicians said she was in a coma.
