CHARLESTON, W. Va., Apr. 2 (UP)—Edgar B. Sims, state auditor and insurance commissioner, has announced that the regular spring meeting of insurance commissioners from nine states will be held in Charleston, Apr. 19 and 20.

Sims explained that the officials, making up zone two of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, meet twice annually to consider problems arising in their various departments. Speakers at the sessions here will include Robert E. Dineen, New York state commissioner, and C. F. J. Harrington, holder of a similar post in Massachusetts.

Represented at the meeting here will be insurance commissioners of

Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and West Virginia.
