

'Scarlet Street' Due To Open At State Theatre Thursday

Ripping off the covers of the time-ripened laws of morality comes the picture "Scarlet Street" opening Thursday at the State theatre. With Edward G. Robinson, Joan Bennett and Dan Duryea, the film shows one of the greatest conflicts ever fought in a man's soul.

The story revolves about a man gifted with an artistic hand. His paintings, altho lacking in perspective, have a definite standing in the field of artistry—this, of course, he is ignorant of. While his wife claims she is going to throw away his paintings and canvases, he has other ideas which prove to be startling.

Wheeling Steel Acquires Plant

WHEELING, W. Va., Apr. 3—(AP)—The Wheeling Steel Corp. announced today its acquisition of the Mingo, O., works of the Carnegie Illinois Steel Corp. for \$2,500,000.

John L. Grimes, public relations officer, said the board of directors of Wheeling Steel had exercised a 1945 option to buy the property.

The Mingo works are located near Wheeling Steel's Steubenville, O., plant, and the layout includes 166 acres of land, three blast furnaces with auxiliary equipment, two 10-ton Bessemer converters, and other facilities.

The announcement said the property would provide necessary land and facilities for future expansion, altho Wheeling Steel has no intention of operating the Mingo plant immediately.

It was explained that A. J. Boynter and Co., Chicago steel mill engineering firm, would be engaged to study development of the project.

Patrick Supports Win-Peace Parley

WASHINGTON, Apr. 3—(UP)—Rep. Luther Patrick, D., Ala., has withdrawn his criticism of the win-the-peace conference scheduled here this week and says he will support it after all.

Patrick withdrew his endorsement of the meeting yesterday following published reports that there were "too many pinks and reds" among the congressional and private persons supporting it.

Sen. Harley M. Kilgore, D., W. Va., one of the senate sponsors, said he knew of no Communist hook-up with the meeting but that he was checking. He said the group had asked him for help in getting a hall in Washington and that he "had helped them out on that."

Coal Stockpiles To Be Rationed

PITTSBURGH, Apr. 3—(INS)—Federal authorities prepared today to ration soft coal stockpiles at the mines in Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia as the walkout of 200,000 miners in the area entered its second day.

The Solid Fuels Administration has "frozen" all coal mined last Friday and Saturday and Saturday. Dealers' sales are limited to hospitals, gas plants and homes with less than a 10-day supply and to industrial plants with less than five days' fuel on hand.

The AFL United Mine Workers union has agreed to mine sufficient coal for Western Pennsylvania utilities and hospitals when their present estimated 60-day stockpiles are exhausted.

Miners thruout the area expect the stoppage to be a long one.

William Hyne, District 4 UMW President, Forecast a protracted walkout but said he expected no breakdown in negotiations.

Quiet was reported in all mine areas. There was no picketing.
