



# Marcus Blasts at Zim, Smith

### **Place Own Interest** Over State's, Charge

Charging that Fred R. Zimmerman, secretary of state, and John M. Smith, state treasurer, place "the temptation to have their names printed on 300,000 checks going into 300,000 homes" above their desire for economy and ef-ficient public service, Ben L. Marcus, commissioner of the state motor vehicle department, today lashed back at Smith's earlier charge that Marcus was to blame for the delay in getting refund checks to motor vehicle license holders.

In a letter to Sen. William A. Trechoff (R-Waukesha) Marcus told his side of the story. 'Law Scems Quite Clear'
