

# More, Better Films Billed To Show in Lima Theatres

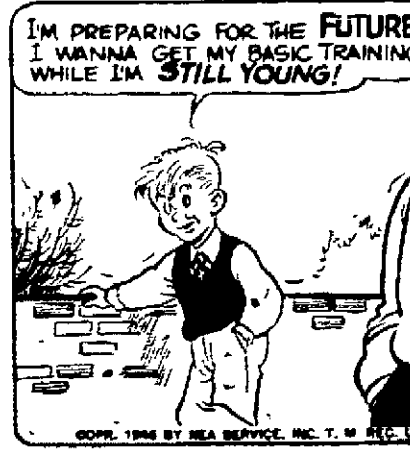
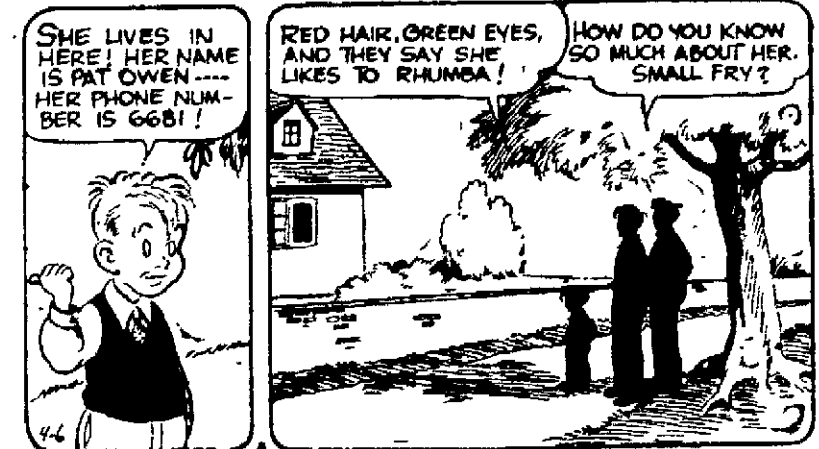
