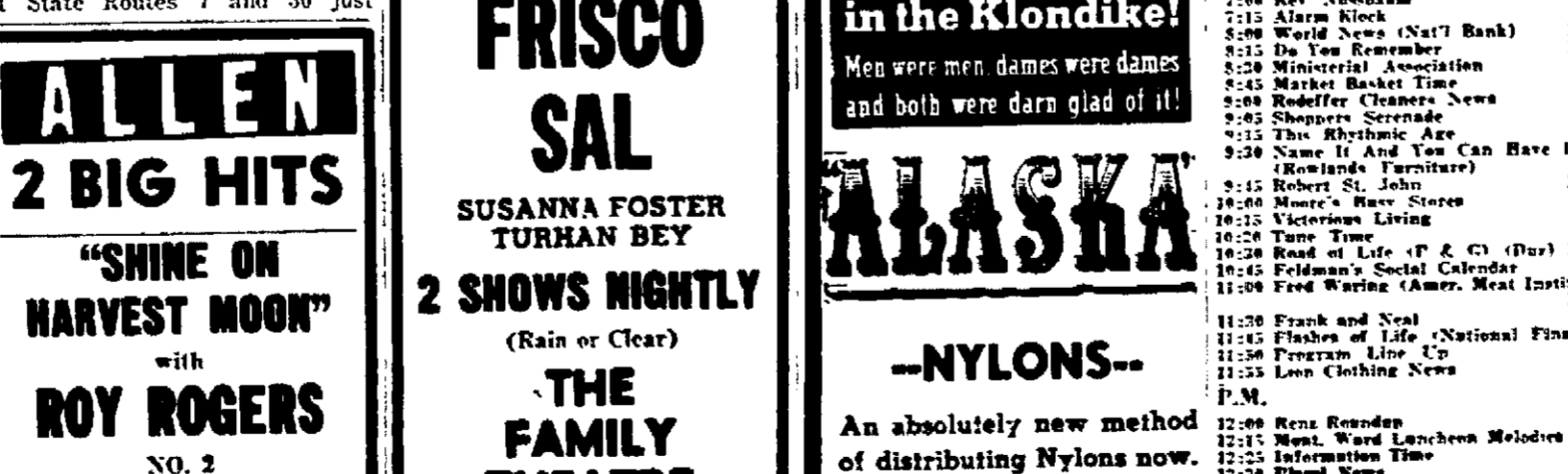
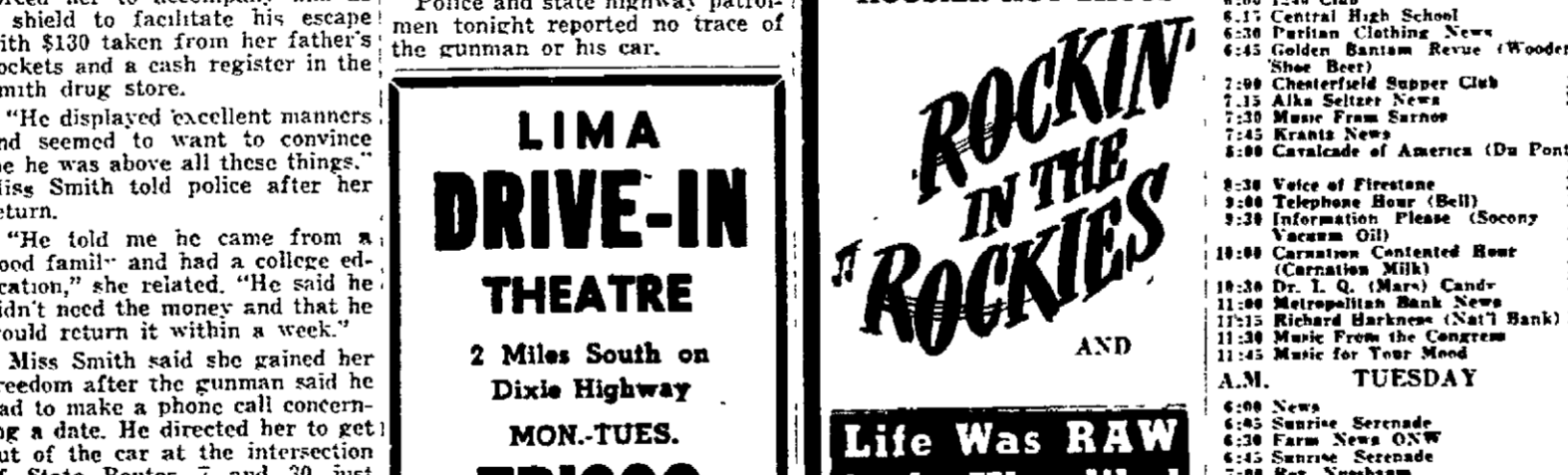
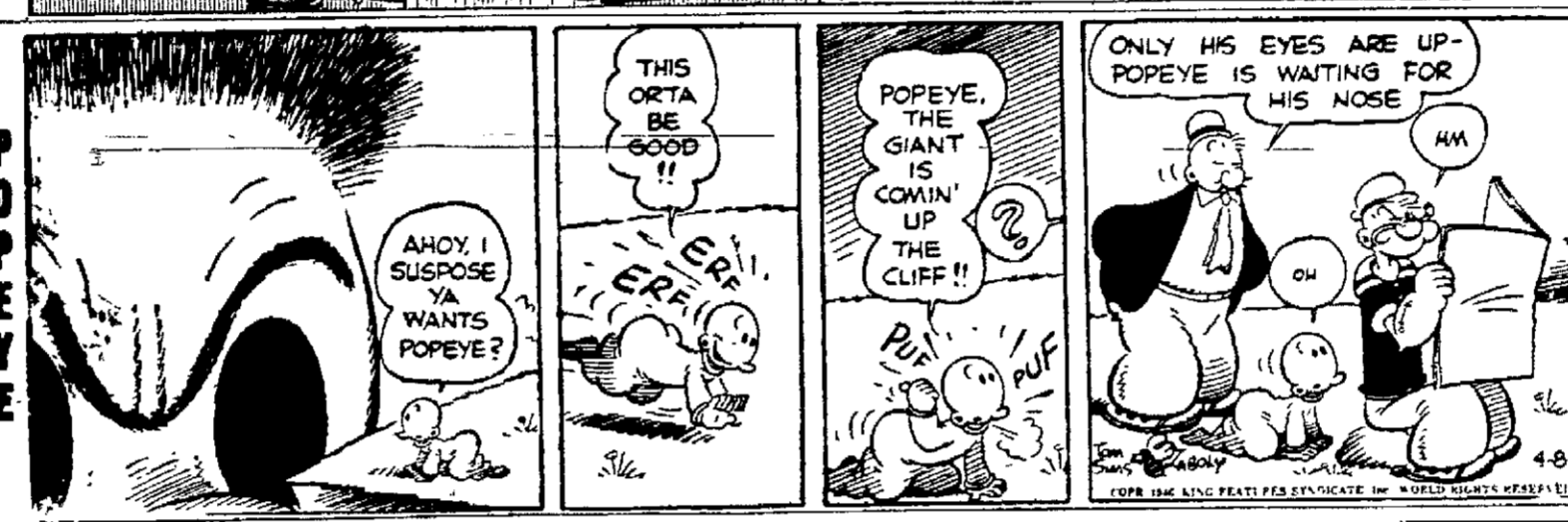

### Kidnap Victim Says Abductor Was Gentleman

YOUNGSTOWN, Apr. 8—(AP)—Patricia Smith, pretty 21-year-old redhead, was back home unharmed tonight after a four-hour kidnaping experience with a gunman she described as a "gentleman bandit."

The girl was ejected from the gunman's automobile near East Liverpool early today after he had forced her to accompany him as a shield to facilitate his escape with \$130 taken from her father's pockets and a cash register in the Smith drug store.

"He displayed excellent manners and seemed to want to convince me he was above all these things," Miss Smith told police after her return.

"He told me he came from a good family and had a college education," she related. "He said he didn't need the money and that he would return it within a week."

Miss Smith said she gained her freedom after the gunman said he had to make a phone call concerning a date. He directed her to get out of the car at the intersection of State Routes 7 and 30 just north of East Liverpool and drove away.

The girl then went to a nearby farmhouse and called Youngstown police who returned her to the city.

Smith, father of the abducted girl, told police he was compelled to lie on the floor of his establishment as the gunman rifled his pockets and the cash register.

Patricia said she was led from the store at gunpoint and forced into a 1942 Pontiac club coupe. She said she waved furiously at a gasoline station attendant across the street but that he had not noticed her. The bandit blindfolded her part of the way, she added.

Police and state highway patrolmen tonight reported no trace of the gunman or his car.
