U. S. Forest Experts Plan Meet at FPL
 The program of the Forest Products Laboratory's first full year of peacetime research since Pearl Harbor, beginning July 1, will be reviewed here Monday through Friday at a conference of about 25 Forest Service officials from all parts of the country. The conference marks the resumption of such gatherings, which were held annually in pre-war years as a means of shaping the laboratory's research, more closely to the nation's forest utilization problems. Attending the conference will be E. I. Kotok, assistant chief of the Forest Service, who, as head of its branch of research, supervises all forest research activities of the service; R. E. McArdle, assistant chief in charge of the branch of state and private forestry; George W. Traver, chief, and Claude C. Bell, of the division of forest products, all stationed at Forest Service headquarters in Washington, D. C. Also here will be top ranking officials of seven regional offices and seven experiment stations and Forest Utilization Service units—the latter established during the past 2 years as agencies to bring results of the Laboratory's research to bear on localized problems of forest industries in the principal forested areas of the country.

U. S. Forest Experts Plan Meet at FPL
