

# 'Colonel Blimp' Begins Run At Sigma on Wednesday

## Three Children Die of Burns

KANSAS CITY, Apr. 9.—(AP)—Three children died from burns incurred in an early morning fire here Monday and their parents and three sisters were hospitalized when flames swept a three-story frame rooming house.

The dead children were Herbert Howard Bellow, 13, Martha, 7, and Harvey, 5. The parents, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Bellow, and three other children, Loretta, 11, Betty, 10, and Nancy Louise, six months, suffered serious but not dangerous burns, according to hospital attendants. A seventh child, Wayne, 2, escaped injury.

An overturned oil lamp was the cause of the fire, according to the fire department report.

None of the children estimated 25 persons living in the rooming house was badly seriously enough to require hospitalization.
