

'Masquerade in Mexico' Due For Engagement at State

A riotous love story is to be found in the film, "Masquerade in Mexico" opening at the State theatre Thursday and starring Dorothy Lamour and Arturo de Cordova.

Disguised as a countess, a young woman, goes to Mexico to meet the man to whom she is to be married, later discovering that a package which she is delivering to him on the trip contains a stolen diamond. Miss Lamour does well in the role of the countess and Arturo de Cordova plays the role of the romantic matador.

One of the funniest films to reach Lima screens in a long time is the film "Road to Utopia" now showing at the Ohio theatre and starring Bing Crosby, Bob Hope and Dorothy Lamour. Based on one of the craziest themes of any film to date, the picture tells of two vaudevillians who come across a map of a gold mine and of their efforts to hold on to the piece of paper.

In his radio thriller, Elery Queen himself falls in love with a frustrated girl who is unable to catch a husband, which sort of dashes a stream of water on the torch which his secretary, Nikki Porter has been carrying for the sick sleuth.
