

Deanna Durbin Due at Ohio For Engagement on Friday

Deanna Durbin comes to the screen once more, this time in "Because of Him" in which she is starred with Franchot Tone and Charles Laughton.

Opening Friday at the Ohio theatre, the film tells of the efforts of a girl to crash the stage. How her efforts in pursuit of a role that she knew she could play finally brings what she wants. Charles Laughton is cast in one of his gayest roles since he played in the "Canterville Ghost."

Bowing out Thursday at the Quilna theatre will be the film "Walk in the Sun." The picture tells the story of the men of the Lee platoon and how, despite the loss of their commanding officers, they faced untold dangers. "Live Wires" and "A Woman Who Came Back" are the two films coming Friday.

An English film which packs plenty of punch is the picture "Colonel Blimp" starring Deborah Kerr, Anton Walbrook and Roger Livesey. Miss Kerr plays a triple role—very unusual in the realm of motion pictures—and does a fine job of it. When tricked into delivering a stolen jewel to the man she thought she loved, Miss Lamour cuts all binding strings and strikes out on her own. What happens will bring many a merry laugh from all. The billing is shared by "Idea Girl" with Jean Barker.

Often read about, but seldom seen, are the prison ships which smuggled persons in and out of a country. Currently showing at the Lyric theatre is the film "Prison Ship" which will prove to be both exciting and full of suspense. The co-feature is "Beyond the Pecos."

Dave O'Brien is in "Rangers Take Over" now playing at the Allen theatre. Plenty of western thrills will be found in this picture which has as its co-feature, "Torture Ship" with Lyle Talbot. Boris Karloff is engaged in a gruesome business in the picture "Body Snatchers" now playing at the Majestic theatre. Karloff plays the role of a man whose business is robbing graves. COLUMBUS, Apr. 11—(AP)—Thirty-six of the 44 incumbents on the Republican state central and executive committees will seek re-election in the May 7 primary, State Chairman Fred Johnson said today.

Johnson, who outlined the party's plans for the fall campaign at the group's meeting here yesterday, announced the following new appointments:

Ralph Wolfe of Columbus—head of the veterans' division at state headquarters; State Rep. C. Willjam O'Neill of Marietta—head of

the division of Young Republican clubs; Albertus Gonn of Cleveland—head of the Negro voters' division.

Mrs. W. W. Wheatcraft of Galion was elected as committee member from the Eighth District to succeed Mrs. Willa Broilier of Mt. Gilead, resigned.
