WASHINGTON, Apr. 12—(AP)—An Allied mission reported today the Greek elections of Mar 31 were "free and fair" and represented "a true and valid verdict" of the Greek people. The mission, composed of United States, British and French representatives stemmed from an agreement at the Yalta conference to help liberated countries set up democratic governments. Russia declined an invitation to participate in the election observance.

Death Penalty Asked for Japs
SHANGHAI, Apr. 12—(AP)—The prosecution asked the death penalty today for all four Japanese officer defendants charged with the execution of three Doolittle fliers. Final summations in the three weeks trial will end tomorrow and a verdict by the military commission is expected next week. The chief prosecutor, Lt. Col. John Hendren of Kansas City, termed the case a "guide post for the future" in his 50-minute closing argument and asked for the supreme penalty. Two of the defendants were members of the mock courtmartial which passed the death sentence on the fliers.
