Two vessels, carrying 1,662 service personnel, are scheduled to arrive today at New York while 11,423 more troops are due to embark from five transports at San Francisco and San Diego, Calif.

In addition, one ship with 1,234 war brides and children is expected at New York.

Ships and units arriving:

AT NEW YORK—Haverford Troop, from Bremerhaven, 966 troops, including 3580th Quartermaster Truck company, Batteries A and B of 398th Anti-Aircraft artillery automatic weapons battalion.

Zanesville Troop, from Le Havre, 696 troops, including 832nd Quartermaster Gas Supply company; 3405th Ordnance Medium Automotive maintenance company, Saturnia from Southampton, 1,234 war brides and children.

AT SAN DIEGO—Gen. G. M. Randall from China, 5,059 navy and marines, including enlisted men of Marine Air Group 12.

AT SAN FRANCISCO—Miscellaneous troops on following vessels: General Heinzelman, 3,601 army; Pitt from Guam, 784 navy; 1,105 marines; Golden City from Pearl Harbor, 1,402 navy; two army; William Harris Hardy from Honolulu, 10 navy.

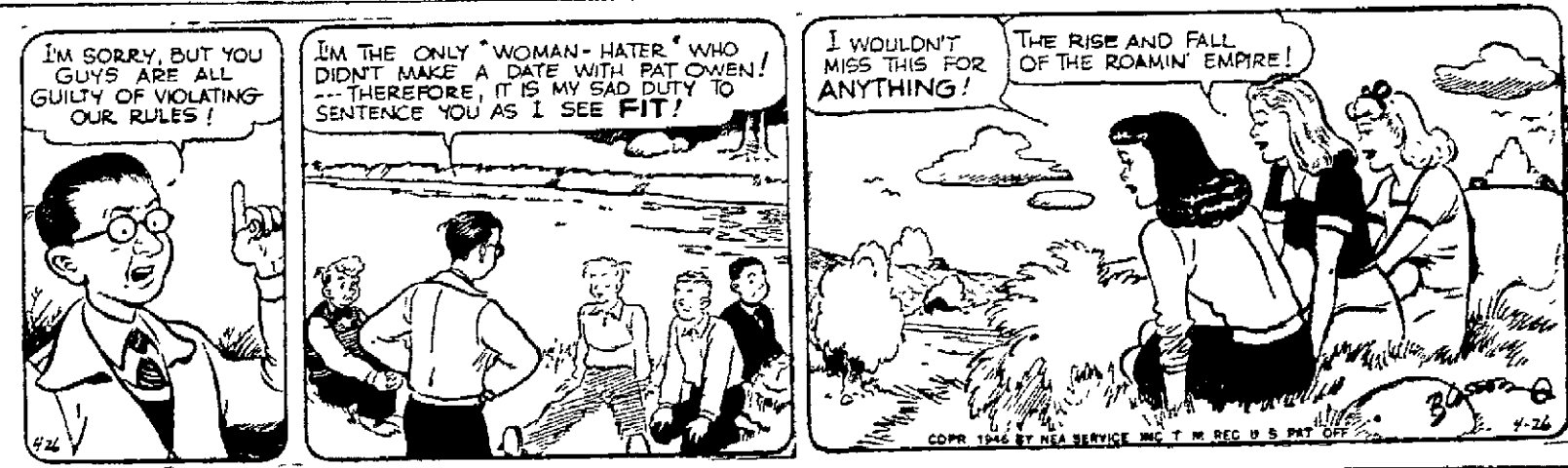
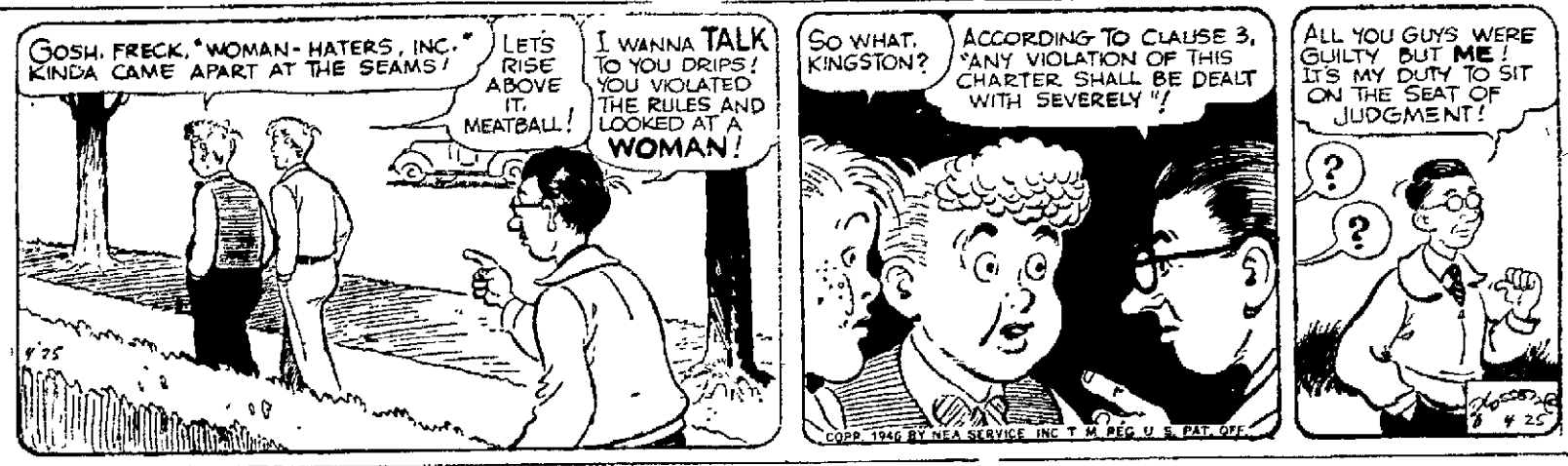

Ohio GAR Plans Annual Session

COLUMBUS, Apr. 27—(UP)—The Ohio department of the Grand Army of the Republic will hold its 80th annual encampment in Columbus June 9 to 13, it was announced today by Department Secretary Miss Lida Lucas of Columbus.

Only seven remain of the 49,011 who filled the ranks of the Ohio department in 1890. They range in age from 98 to 103.

Oldest member is Oakley H. Bailey of Alliance, but he will not be present. John R. Bennett of Waynesfield, who will be 101 May 11, is the senior member expected to attend the encampment.

Department Commander John H. Grate will be 101 on Aug. 1. Hiram Conrad, 98, of Alliance; Frederick Pfister, 100, of Cincinnati; and Levis Hiestor, 99, of Pleasantville are the others expected to answer this year's roll call. The seventh Ohioan is Porter Parker of Niles, who will not attend the encampment.
